



New Rules for District Qualifiers Help Ensure Competitive Play at the Midwest Outdoor Closed

The District Junior Qualifier tournament results across the Midwest Section are used to advance players into the Midwest Closed Outdoor Championships held in June. In an effort to have better quality play at the Midwest Outdoor Closed, the Midwest Section Junior Competitive Pathway Committee has come up with the first step to achieve this result. While Southeastern Michigan is one of the largest Districts in the Midwest with plenty of high caliber players, other Districts vary in size and number of competitive junior players. The number of Quota spot (guaranteed entry) players per District is derived from each District's percentage of USTA Jr. Membership population. Before 2015, Midwest Closed draw sizes of 128 had 120 players "endorsed" by their District, leaving an additional 8 spots open for each division, who were chosen off the most current Midwest Standing List at the time of deadline (after all District Qualifiers and Cup Team events were completed). This process resulted in draws that were not populated by the top players of the Midwest Section, and included both low Standing List position players gaining entry and high Standing List position players not getting into the event. There were various plans proposed, but ultimately the one that succeeded was a District Quota total of 102 players, which left *26 players* in each division being chosen from the most current Midwest Standing List at the time of deadline. This new rule will result in Southeast Michigan receiving twelve (12) Quota Spots in each division, which will be derived from the Quarterfinalists in both the main and consolation draw of our District Junior Qualifier. All other players who play and complete the Southeast Michigan Qualifier (and win at least one match) will be endorsed as Alternates into the Midwest Closed utdoor Championships in order of their Standing Position on the Midwest Section Standing List published after the last weekend of all District Qualifiers.

Other new procedures include a Play and Complete requirement and the forfeiture of any Quota spot from a player not able to advance to the Midwest Outdoor Closed. In prior years, a District was able to substitute their next Standing List player into one of their abandoned Quota positions. This year, a District will lose their abandoned Quota Spot and it will return to the "Midwest Pool" where it will be filled with an additional player chosen off the Midwest Standing List. This procedure should ensure that the top Standing List players make it into the Outdoor Closed event.

The Midwest Committee has also put in place "Play and Complete" requirements that in

the past were left to a District's discretion. Play and Complete means that no match (including any consolation draw matches) can end in a walkover or default; however, a retirement in the main will allow a player to compete in the Consolation Draw to fulfill their Play and Complete requirement. An Appeal process will be available for any player who entered the Southeast Michigan District Qualifier and did not play and complete all matches in order to be considered

for endorsement into the Midwest Closed Outdoor Championship.

While all these rules and procedures are important for the top finishers of our District Qualifier to ensure they are not overlooked for advancement, our desire is to offer a great event for all players. Deadline for our Qualifier (see page 3) is fast approaching. Don't miss your opportunity to play against Southeast Michigan finest!

- 1. Players from the top 50 of the most current USTA/Midwest Section Standing List in next lower division based on the following draw sizes:
 - 64 draw top 8 players from the lower age group (exception: top 4 players from the 10s for the Boys 12s division).
 - 48 draw top 6 players from the lower age group (exception: top 3 players from the 10s for the Girls 12s division).
 32 draw - top 4 players from the lower age group.
 24 draw - top 2 players from the lower age group.
- 2. Remaining players will be selected from the specified USTA/Midwest Section Standing List in the age division of the event. Alternates will be selected from the USTA/Midwest Section Standing List in the division of the event and will be numbered and posted on tournament home page after tournament dead-

SEEDING: Seeding will be determined using the same USTA/Midwest Section Standing List used for se-

FORMAT: Main draw format will be two-out-of-three sets, with the third set played out in its entirety. (There is a mandatory 10-minute break between the second and third sets FOR ALL AGE GROUPS). Consolation draw format will be two-out-of-three sets with a tie-break in lieu of the third set. (There is a 3-minute break between the second and third sets FOR ALL AGE GROUPS). Main Draw will be played to completion and Feed-In Consolation played to the Quarterfinals.

First Round matches will begin as early as 4:00 p.m. Friday with Monday 5:00 p.m. finals (Tuesday finals, rain date).

This tournament is open to Southeast Michigan District residents only. Entrant must be a legal resident of Hillsdale, Lenawee, Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Oakland, St. Clair, Wayne, or Washtenaw county.

ENTRANTS MUST PROVIDE BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING: Proof of Residency and Proof of Citizenship.

2015 Southeast Michigan Points Per Round for Juniors

Points are accrued by a player depending on what round they achieve in any tournament. The level of the tournament determines the amount of points accrued (referred to as the "weight" of the tournament) "Byes" do not qualify as wins; however, defaults, retirements, walkovers and withdrawals do (for the advancing player). Please note that tournaments carry different "weights" at the Section level (i.e. a District Level 4 Tournament is a Midwest Section Level 5 Tournament) and have a different Point Table (refer to the Midwest Section Point Table at right).

Southeast Michigan Singles Ranking

A player must play and complete the Southeast Michigan Muthig District Qualifier or two Southeast Michigan District sanctioned tournaments in order to be considered for a final year-end District Ranking. A player's final ranking will be based on the best 6 tournaments in a specific age group from Jan. 1-Dec. 31st. A player must have earned a minimum of 32 points in an age division in order to be included in the Southeast Michigan District Final Rankings (eligibility requirements must be met).

Standing List: A standing list is a tentative strength listing of players including match results from the previous 12 months. A player must earn 8 points in an age division in order to appear on the Southeastern Michigan Standing List. A player's best 6 tournaments will be used. Matche's played in a player's actual age division as well as any higher age division(s) will be included in the calculation of the Standings. The Standing List is a rolling calendar (today, back 364 days).







Southeast Michigan's Tennis Achievements Honored at our 2014 District Awards Banquet

Last November at our Annual Awards Banquet, our District took time to acknowledge some of our young players and adults who exemplify the good in tennis.

THE HOXIE AWARD

The Jean and Jerry Hoxie Memorial Award is given to a young male and female tennis player in Southeast Michigan who has made a great contribution to the game of tennis through their good sportsmanship and achievements both on and off the tennis court.

2014 Female Hoxie Award Recipient: SOPHIA ABELSON



Sophia started her athletic career playing golf at the age of 2. By age 8, she won the Michigan State Championships 3 years in a row and finished 26th at the World Championships. At age 5, Sophia was introduced to tennis and immediately fell in love with the sport where her ability became quickly evident. When she was 10, she finished 3rd at the Little Mo tournament. Although Sophia enjoyed success at both golf and tennis, by the age of 10, she convinced her parents to concentrate solely

on tennis. Over the next few years, she won a Midwest Designated singles title, a National Open doubles, placed 3rd at the Midwest Closed, and finished her last year of 12s ranked #1 in the Midwest and #18 Nationally.

Just when things were coming together so nicely, Sophia developed the first of three stress fractures in her tibia. Shortly after returning from these injuries, she tore ligaments in her wrist and fractured her other tibia. Sophia missed most of her first year of 14s. Once healthy, Sophia won three more National Open doubles tournaments, finished fourth in doubles in a National Hard Court tournament and was a finalist in singles in a National Open and National Regional.

As passionate as Sophia is about tennis, she has always understood the value of a good education and giving back to the community. Home schooled, Sophia holds a 4.5 GPA, has taken 6 AP classes, 5 honor classes and is a member of the National Honor Society. In addition, she volunteered at multiple fundraising events for breast cancer, volunteered as a camp counselor and a tutor, held bake sales for Alzheimer's research, and drove senior citizens to various appointments. Through discipline, structure, and a big heart, Sophia has been able to uphold lofty academic goals while positively impacting the community.

A four-star recruit, Sophia has committed to play tennis and attend Xavier College in the fall, with a desire to pursue a Law degree. Sophia likes to cook, play golf and hang out with friends in her spare time.

2014 Male Hoxie Award Recipient: TIMOTHY WANG



Tim started playing tennis at the age of 8, and by 12 had become one of our top Southeast Michigan players (participating on our 12s District Cup Team). After capturing a Midwest Designated title, he won 3 more prestigious titles with the Court One Memorial Day Championship (18s), the Midwest Outdoor Closed (16s), and the first of two straight High School State Championships at #1 Singles in Division 1. In 2014, Tim was our Muthig District Qualifier

Champion and ranked #1 in Southeast Michigan. Named co-captain of his high school team, Tim captured his second state title at #1 Singles in Division 1, and led his team to its first state title in school history. Tim also earned a place on the High School All American Team for the past two seasons.

He is a 4-time Michigan High School Tennis Coaches Association All State Player named "Mr. Tennis" with an impressive 2014 HS record of 108-14.

Off the court, Tim was the District Chess Champion in 2005 and was voted student council class president his sophomore year. He scored an impressive 2290 on the SAT Collegiate Entrance Exam and is a 2015 National Merit Semifinalist ranking him among the top 1% of high school seniors in the nation. He holds a 3.98 GPA at Novi High School landing him in the top 10% of his class. He has taken 11 AP, IB, and honors courses and also explored his future career interests by taking business electives.

Outside his academics, Tim volunteers with the Novi High School girl's tennis team while also serving as a mentor and hitting partner with the Sports Club West Bloomfield junior tennis program.

A four star recruit, Tim has committed to Columbia University where he will play tennis and study economics. Tim has an older sister Jenny and currently lives in Novi where he likes to read, listen to music and spend time with friends.

2014 Beyer Award Recipient: SEMTA Past President MEL KROPKO

Mel Kropko was born and raised in Akron, Ohio where at the age of 24 he was introduced to the sport of tennis by his younger, college-age brother. His father taught his brother how to play and the unorthodox skills his brother passed along were enough for them to win tournaments together during his days in Ohio.

A 1972 graduate of the University of Akron with a degree in microbiology, Mel moved to Ann Arbor in 1979 to head up a new lab at Parke Davis (which later became Pfizer) and earned his Masters in microbiology from Eastern Michigan University in 1994. He is now the Director of Clinical Operations at INC Research, a global research organization. All the while, his passion for tennis remained strong. Not only did Mel enjoy playing, he became a USTA verifier and also received his PTR certification.

In 1998, Mel embarked on another on-court activity – officiating. Not only was he a roving umpire, he soon became the District Chairperson of Officials, conducting training classes for new and returning umpires at the USTA and ITA levels. In 2003, Mel became a Delegate on the SEMTA Board, Treasurer in 2006, Secretary in 2008, Vice President in 2010 and President in 2012. 
