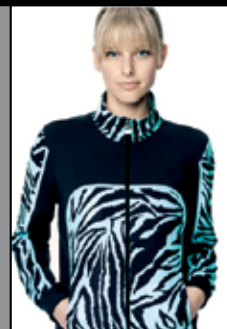

We envision communities where all kids are introduced to tennis in their schools, where they are given the opportunity to then get involved in after-school programs in elementary, middle school and high school.

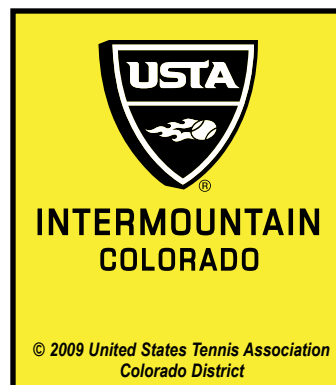
We believe tennis gives kids the tools to learn, compete and win in life – through proper practice, dedication, knowledge and respect.

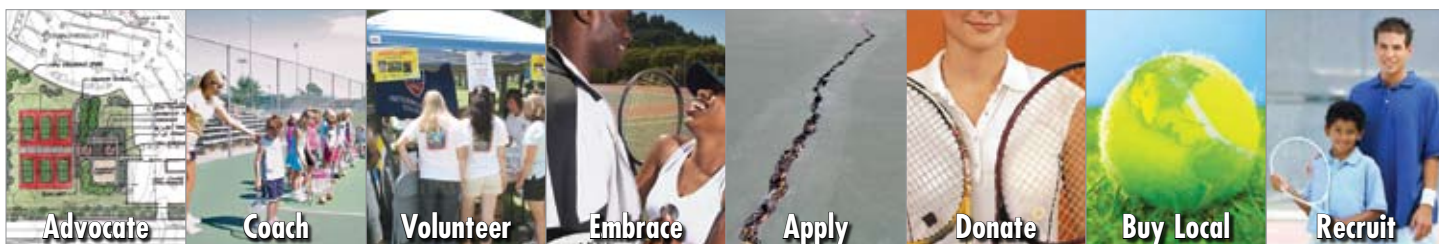

## IT'S YOUR SERVE//ADVOCATE

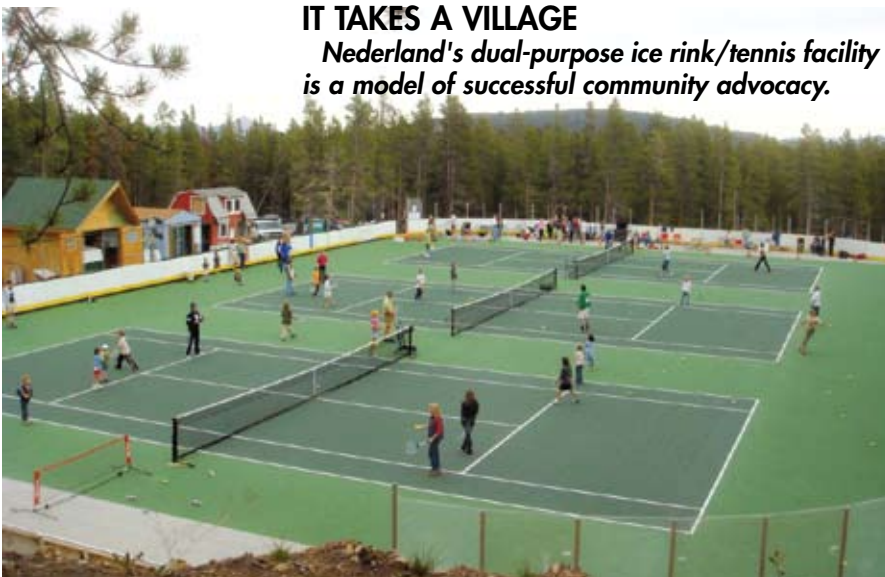

Fueled by local volunteers, these non-profit associations exist to promote and develop the game of tennis in the community.

CTAs can be the foundation for successful advocacy programs to build, refurbish and/or maintain community tennis facilities. USTA Colorado's advocacy agenda is motivated by the conviction that the sport of tennis can be an important part of improving communities, schools and the quality of life for all. As members of the USTA family, we know how tennis can make a difference, but our charge as advocates is to convince decision-makers in the public, private and non-profit sectors of this in order to gain their support. Who was the best coach you ever had? It doesn't matter if it was a tennis coach, a baseball coach or a life coach. What made them great?

Were they patient? Were they hard-nosed? Were they inspirational?

While many coaches feel as if their primary role is to teach the rules and skills of a particular sport, great coaches are truly measured by their ability to impart their love of the sport to their players and inspire them to achieve their dreams.

Anyone with a passion for tennis can be a great coach, regardless of experience level or proficiency. You can help make a difference in your community by becoming a Recreational Coach.

A Recreational Coach can be anyone: parents seeking the basics in coaching and organizing team tennis; park and recreation instructors, high school and seasonal coaches; coaches teaching kids and adults who are new to the game; current players seeking part-time teaching jobs.

In addition to the numerous opportunities for Rec Coaches at the grassroots level, we need help from Rec Coaches to act as clinicians in the USTA School Tennis program, which provides elementary, middle and high school youngsters an opportunity to learn the basic skills of tennis by exposing them to the sport in their physical education classes.

Since 2001, over 550 schools have implemented tennis into their PE curriculum with all of the tools and resources USTA Colorado is able to provide through USTA School Tennis. Tennis is an affordable sport to play, but many organizations simply can't afford to offer tennis to their communities, let alone expand their tennis programs and resources.

That's why USTA Colorado and the Colorado Youth Tennis Foundation offer various program and resource grants to provide financial assistance to start or expand public tennis programs and to help cover program expenses such as tennis equipment, instructors, court time and publicity.

Public tennis facilities seeking funds to repair and/or upgrade existing tennis courts, court equipment and amenities may qualify for up to \$5,000 through a USTA Colorado Adopt-A-Court grant.

Priority is given to those programs which promote and develop the growth of tennis, target new players and/or link to USTA programs like Tennis Block Parties, Tennis Welcome Centers or League Tennis.

## IT'S YOUR SERVE//DONATE

Many of us don't do much with our old tennis equipment. We hang our old racquets in the garage, let the balls gather dust or just toss them into the trash when they begin to lose their bounce. But as outreach efforts continue to help recruit new players in underserved communities, there's an increased demand for used equipment. To help fill this demand, the Colorado Youth Tennis Foundation is launching a new recycling program to bring the great sport of tennis to anybody desiring to play by collecting used racquets and used balls.

The mission of the Racquets for All program is to collect, assess, refurbish and distribute tennis racquets, tennis balls and other tennis equipment to individuals and organizations lacking access throughout the state of Colorado.

The equipment will be distributed to individuals and organizations in Colorado presently lacking access to tennis equipment. Racquets for All places a donation barrel in participating clubs and other locations in which players can deposit their unwanted racquets and tennis balls. Besides depositing used equipment, club members may also participate by volunteering to empty the donation barrels and deliver the contents once or twice a month to an area collection site.

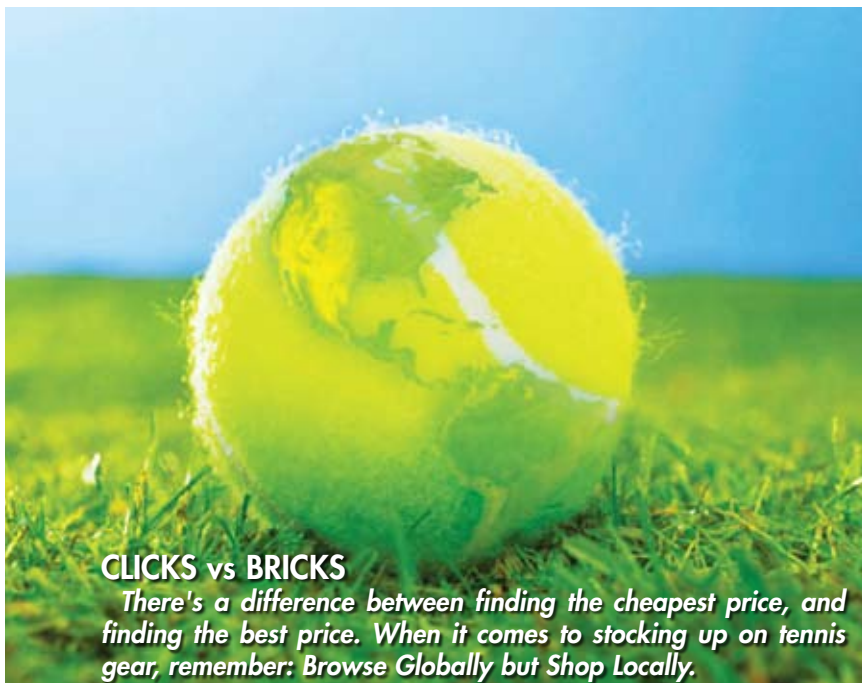
Tennis players love to get new stuff. And as consumers, we utilize an array of resources to find what we want at the lowest price.

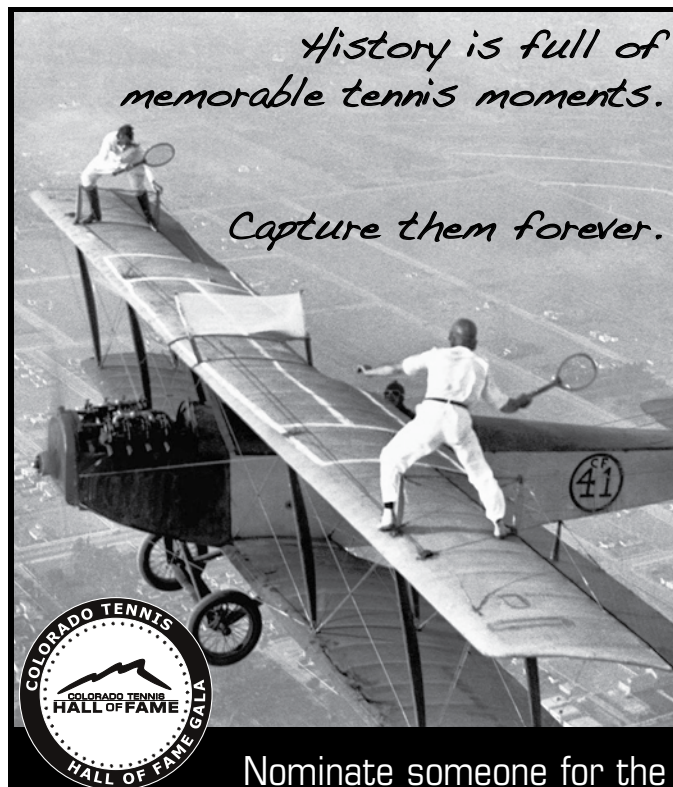

## WHERE DO I START?

With more than 3,500 participants in the Colorado Junior Team Tennis program, and more than 80 facilities across the state that offer Junior Team Tennis programming, there's a very good chance that you can locate a team in your local club or nearby park. We can help you locate a facility near you that offers Junior Team Tennis, just contact our Junior League Department at 303/695-4116 x207.

But if you can't find a local team, or if you'd prefer to start one on your own, we've compiled a short list of steps you'll need to follow:

### 1. PICK A WINNER

The first step in creating a winning team is to designate a good captain/coordinator. This person doesn't have to have any tennis credentials, but must be detail oriented and be able to handle all of the administrative duties for the squad – including registering players, determining weekly rosters, communicating with other captains and reporting scores.

*Whether or not you have any experience playing or coaching tennis, you can be a successful Junior Team Tennis League Coach. Most importantly, always keep things in perspective. As a volunteer coach, you do not need to teach the kids to have perfect form. Keep your practices fun and simple. In general, a focus on hand-eye coordination is the best way to improve performance. When leading a practice, discard boring drills in favor of games that incorporate as many kids as safely possible. If an activity is successful, don't hesitate to use it again and again. And remember, there's no substitute for a scrimmage. Good luck on the court, be safe, and have fun!*

### 2. EVALUATE YOUR COMMUNITY

You'll need to check on court availability at local parks, schools and commercial or private clubs. Make sure courts can accommodate scheduled practices and matches. Also, be mindful of the times you choose, as the participation of parents and other volunteers will be vital to your team's success.

### 3. ATTENDING THE MANDATORY CAPTAIN/COORDINATOR MEETING

Every Junior Team Tennis coach/captain/coordinator is required to attend one of the meetings at the USTA Colorado office. The purpose of these meetings is to review league details and operating procedures for the upcoming season.

It improves flexibility, stamina, speed, strength and hand-eye coordination. It exercises all major muscle groups, pro-

viding a full-body workout. Even if you only play a couple of times a week you can feel the benefit. In just 30 minutes of singles, you can burn more than 350 calories, depending on the intensity.

And perhaps the best part is, it doesn't cost a lot. For about the cost of a single day skiing, you can join a tennis league and play for the entire summer, and still have money left over to buy a round for all your new friends that you met on the court.

## ORGANIZE YOUR OWN ADULT LEAGUE TEAM

### *Four Easy Steps to Starting a Adult League Tennis Team*

Whether you're having trouble finding a league team, or if you'd just rather play with all your tennis buddies, starting an adult league team is a very simple process.

#### STEP 1: MAKE CONTACT

The first thing you must do is contact your Area League Coordinator (ALC). ALCs will assist you in finding additional players, locating courts, and reviewing rules for local play. The Coordinator's role is also to share information on the league tennis rules of play and to provide you with all pertinent dates and registration deadlines.

#### STEP 2: DETERMINE ELIGIBILITY

It is important to remember that all adult league players must have a current USTA membership (World Team Tennis excluded). If you wish to start an Adult League Tennis Team but are not a current USTA Member, you can sign up online at [USTA.com](http://USTA.com). There you check out all the great benefits a USTA Membership has to offer.

Remember the following when thinking about the type of team you wish to start:

- Players must be 19 years old in the calendar year in which they wish to complete on an adult team.
- Seniors must be 50 years of age in the calendar year in which they wish to compete to play on a Senior team.
- Super Seniors must be at least 60.
- Use our League Finder on page 28 to assist you in finding the right leagues.
- Each league requires a minimum number of players to get a team in the league. View the league calendar to see what the minimum number is for each league.
- Each league has divisions based on specific Levels of Play. This system is referred to as the National Tennis Ratings Program (NTRP). Players must have a current computer rating or have to self-rate at the time of registration. For more information, please visit [COLORADOTENNIS.com](http://COLORADOTENNIS.com) and click the NTRP tab.

#### STEP 3: FINDING COURTS

##### *Playing at a location that has existing league teams*

If you plan to play out of a site that currently offers leagues,

simply contact the facility coordinator and ask for a team number. Once you have the team number, you and your teammates can register on TennisLink (skip to Step 4). If you do not know who the facility coordinator is, contact us.

##### *Playing at a new location*

If you plan to use a site that does not currently offer league tennis, please contact our adult league department to let us know that you are starting a new team in a new location. There are a few simple steps that will need to happen prior to getting your new team involved when it is a new location.

- 1) Each location involved in leagues must have a current USTA Organizational Membership. Find out if the site you plan to use has an organizational membership and if it is current with the USTA.
- 2) All leagues require a minimum of three (3) courts per site and must be available during scheduled match times throughout the league season.
- 3) Each location must have a person recognized by USTA Colorado as the Facility Coordinator. This person is the primary contact person for us and is responsible for reserving courts, appointing captains, communicating important league information to captains, and ensuring that the league experience for all players at your location is a pleasant and organized one.
- 4) USTA Colorado's league department communicates important information to all facility coordinators in an annual meeting. Attendance is mandatory. If meetings have all passed, we will schedule a time to meet with you individually (new facility coordinators only).
- 5) We will provide you with team numbers for the teams you plan to host at your new location.

#### STEP 4: TEAM REGISTRATION

Once you have confirmed your site and obtained team numbers, you can register on TennisLink, the USTA's automated league registration system ([COLORADOTENNIS.com](http://COLORADOTENNIS.com) and through the Helpful Links menu select ADULT LEAGUES).

## ACT YOUR AGE

In order to participate in USTA Colorado's Adult League Tennis Series, players must turn 19 years old by 12/31/2009 (World Team Tennis players must be 18 by the same date). USTA Colorado also offers several senior leagues for those who want to "act their age." Players 50+ (or turning 50 by 12/31/2009) are invited to participate in the USTA Senior League, 55+ in the recreational Senior Breakfast League, and 60+ (or turning 60 by 12/31/2009) in the USTA Super Senior League.

## FORMATS

Each adult league offers opportunities for players to compete in singles (s), doubles (d), or both (sd). USTA Colorado offers three Combo Doubles leagues: USTA Mixed, USTA Super Senior and ITA Fall Mixed. Levels are determined by combining the partners' NTRP rating. In each of these leagues, the rating spread between partners cannot be greater than 1.0 level (i.e., in a 7.5 level, a 3.0 cannot play with a 4.5). World Team Tennis utilizes a slightly different calculation to determine a team's level. Please contact USTA Colorado for specific details.

## THE END OF THE ROAD

Each of USTA Colorado's adult leagues culminates in a season-ending championship. But certain leagues offer advancement to Sectional and/or National Championships. The easiest way to determine the end point is to look at the prefix of each league: USTA Leagues culminate in a National Championship; ITA Leagues finish up at a Sectional Championship; and CTA leagues end the season at a District (State) Championship.

The World Team Tennis league competes in a series of national qualifiers rather than a strict league season, and the Senior Breakfast League offers three seasonal sessions: Spring, Summer and Fall.

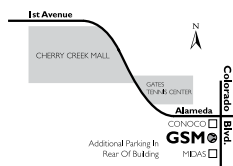

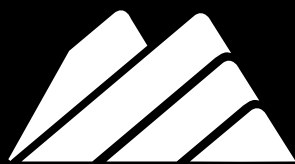

# TOURNAMENT TENNIS

## FINDING THE RIGHT EVENT:

Many factors can help determine the right event for you or your child. Age, skill level, fitness and length of tournament can all be deciding factors in determining which tournaments you should enter. Here's some basic information about the types of events Colorado has to offer:

### QuickStart:

New in 2009, QuickStart events offer our youngest players (5-10 years old) the chance to compete in a kid-friendly environment, complete with appropriate-sized equipment, smaller courts and slower-moving balls. For additional information, please see our Guide to the QuickStart Format page 57.

### Junior Novice:

Novice events offer juniors the opportunity to experience tournament play and competition in a supportive and non-threatening environment.

Novice players have no previous competitive experience in tournament play (above the novice level), and have typically played tennis for two years or less. Because these events are non-sanctioned, a USTA membership is not required and results do not count towards rankings.

### Junior Satellite:

Satellite events offer junior players the opportunity to experience the next level of competitive play. Acting as a bridge between Novice and Championship-level events, Satellite events cater to players with one to three years of beginning competitive experience (i.e., novice tournaments, CARA, novice or intermediate USTA Junior Team Tennis play). Once a player has gained confidence in novice tournaments, or has won a total of three different novice events in any combination of singles, doubles, or mixed, that player can reasonably compete at the Satellite level.

A player is ineligible for the Satellite level play if:

1. Player attained a National or Sectional (Intermountain region) ranking the previous year;
2. Player reached:
  - a) the quarterfinals of a Designated Championship tournament (in-district), or
  - b) the semifinals of any sanctioned Championship tournament event (in-district).

A Satellite Ineligibility List will be published annually based on the prior year's results. The Seeding & Ranking Committee periodically may determine additional players to be ineligible for Satellite level play based on recent Championship or Satellite tournament results. Players are strongly encouraged to play within their age group in the Championship level rather than playing up an age group in the Satellite level. The Seeding and Ranking Committee will consider written

appeals from players for the Satellite ineligible list until April 14, 2009.

### Junior Championship:

The Championship level is designed for the junior player who is seeking the highest level of junior competition in Colorado. Satellite players who are seeking more advanced tournament play may also compete at this level.

Players listed on the 2009 Satellite Ineligible List – published on [COLORADOTENNIS.com](http://COLORADOTENNIS.com) in March 2009 – are required to play at this level. Juniors seeking to compete at the Sectional and National levels are encouraged to compete in Championship-level events.

### NTRP Events:

Designed to pit players of compatible skill against one another. NTRP levels range from 2.5 to 5.0 **Note: players rated above 5.0 are required to play in the Open division; any junior player 18 & under MUST play in the Open division, unless the player turns 19 by December 31, 2009. They are then eligible to compete in an NTRP event, but must contact the Tournament Director for entry.**

You may play at or above your specific NTRP level, but not below your rating. If you don't have a current rating, you may self-rate and play in that division. For information on NTRP ratings, see [COLORADOTENNIS.com](http://COLORADOTENNIS.com).

### Senior/Family Events:

Also called age division events, Senior events pit players 30 and older against similarly aged competitors. In Family events, the only requirement is that the partners be related (there are no upper or lower age limits). But be aware: there are no skill parameters in Senior or Family events. A player in the draw may be an expert, a novice, or anywhere in between. **Players must be of division age by December 31, 2009, and may not play in an older division.**

# 09 RANKINGS REQUIREMENTS

In Colorado, all Senior, NTRP, Championship, Family events, and Junior Satellite tournaments utilize a Points Per Round (PPR) system to determine Colorado rankings. If you're unfamiliar with PPR, it is a very simple process. Players earn points for each win, plus earn bonus points for wins over "Top 20" players. Sanctioned events are broken down to Designated/Level 1 and non-Designated/Level 2 tournaments (see revised 2009 chart below).

Level 1 tournaments carry more points than Level 2 events.

The USTA Colorado Ranking Review Committee reserves the right to modify the ranking requirements if deemed necessary or appropriate.

The Ranking Review Committee has revised the championship and NTRP divisions minimum point requirements for this year, which will likely affect the number of ranked players in 2009.

## 2009 RANKING REQUIREMENTS (ALL EVENTS EXCEPT JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP)

### NTRP SINGLES/DOUBLES REQUIREMENTS:

Players accumulating a minimum of 250 points during the calendar year will earn a year-end ranking. Only a player's three best results\* at Colorado sanctioned events will count towards a ranking.

### SENIOR (30-80)/FAMILY REQUIREMENTS:

Players accumulating a minimum of 100 points during the calendar year will earn a year-end ranking. Only a player's two best results at Colorado sanctioned events\* will count towards a ranking.

### CHAMPIONSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

Players accumulating a minimum of 200 points during the calendar year will earn a year-end ranking. Only a player's two best results at Colorado sanctioned events\* will count towards a ranking.

### JUNIOR SATELLITE REQUIREMENTS:

Players accumulating a minimum of 150 points during the calendar year will earn a year-end ranking. Only a player's three best results\* at Colorado sanctioned events will count towards a ranking.

## 2009 RANKING REQUIREMENTS (JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP ONLY)

Players accumulating a minimum of 200 points during the calendar year will earn a year-end ranking. Only a player's five best results\* at Colorado sanctioned events will count towards a ranking.

Unlike the standing lists, year-end rankings points will not count down to the lower age division.

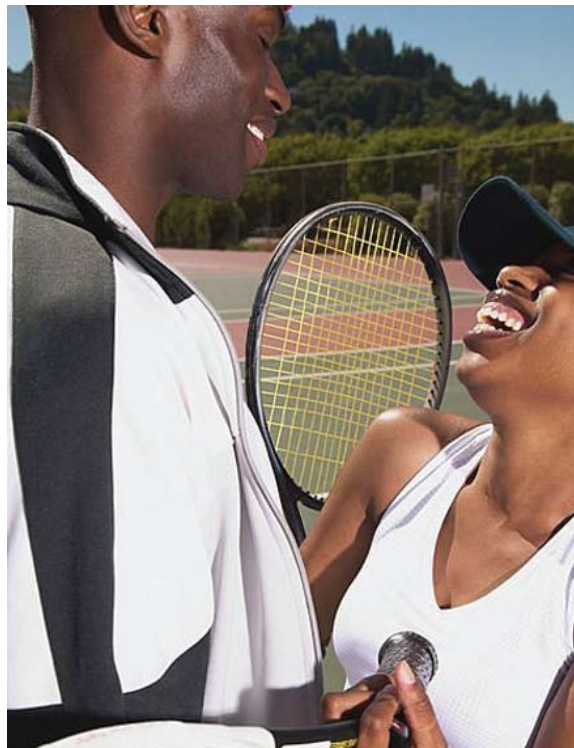

# THE LIST 9 THINGS EVERY COLORADO TOURNAMENT PLAYER SHOULD KNOW

## GETTING "HELP" AT [COLORADOTENNIS.com](http://COLORADOTENNIS.com):

Not to be biased, but our search features are infinitely simpler and more accurate than the USTA's TennisLink. Hit [COLORADOTENNIS.com](http://COLORADOTENNIS.com) and use the "Helpful Links" drop-down menu. Click "Find a Tourney". You can search by tournament name, or division. You can also look for tournaments in progress, those open for registration and completed tournaments. And Finding the tournament site has never been easier. Click "Find a Court", type in the name of the facility and voila. It's like having an **EASY BUTTON**.

## VERIFY ALL TOURNAMENT INFORMATION ONLINE

Players are encouraged to verify all tournament information online. The information provided in the 09 Big Book is accurate at the time of publication, but is not complete. Get draw times, weather announcements, schedule changes, directions, etc. You will find other important information online as well, like what time the player party starts. It is the players' responsibility to obtain and verify all match times. Check the event's online listing two days prior to the start of the event, or verify with tournament staff.

## KEEP YOUR INFORMATION CURRENT WITH THE USTA

In addition to ensuring that you'll receive your Big Book and other vital *Colorado Tennis* publications, keeping the USTA up to date on your contact info is very helpful to tournament directors in case they need to reach you for any reason during an event (Rain Delay, Default, etc.)

## CHECKING YOUR STANDING

You're not vain, you just want to see where you stand in your division. Just go to [COLORADOTENNIS.com](http://COLORADOTENNIS.com) and use the "Helpful Links" menu to access division standings.

## SEEDING/FORMATS

Seedings for Colorado events reflect the most current published Standing Lists. If Joe Smith is #1 in Men's 4.0 singles, he will be seeded #1 in that event. Also, please note that a tournament director and/or committee can alter the schedule or scoring format due to inclement weather or size of the tournament.

## HEY, THAT KID ISN'T OLD ENOUGH TO PLAY NTRP!

Any player that is 18 years-old, but will be turning 19 by Dec. 31, 2009, is eligible to participate in Adult NTRP events. But there's a catch for 18s who want to register for an event: TennisLink is not set up to accommodate you, so you must contact the tournament director to register for the event. They will happily enter you into the draw.

## CHECKING IN

Please plan to arrive at your tournament site at least 15 minutes prior to your first match. This can help in getting matches on earlier if courts are available and is very much appreciated by tournament staff.

## WARMING UP ON TOURNAMENT DAY

Not many events boast open courts during the tournament, so any warm-up prior to a match should be done at a different location. Use the Court Locator at [COLORADOTENNIS.com](http://COLORADOTENNIS.com) to find public courts near the site to warm-up prior to your match.

## COME PREPARED WITH THE ESSENTIALS

Don't assume all sites have water on the courts. Come prepared with plenty of fresh water, a hat and sunscreen, especially for those hot summertime matches. Players of all levels should come prepared to every match with at least two freshly strung tennis racquets.

**FMLC:** *First Match Losers Consolation* – A draw in which the first-round losers and second round losers who advanced to that round by virtue of a bye or default enter the consolation draw.

**FRLC:** *First Round Losers Consolation* – A draw in which only the first-round losers enter the consolation draw.

**MFIC:** *Modified Feed-In Consolation* – A draw in which the main draw losers are fed back into another draw against players who lost in earlier rounds of the tournament.

**ROUND ROBINS** – Multiple match guarantees as players compete against all other players in their flight.

**COMPASS DRAWS** – Player-friendly formats guaranteeing players multiple matches, even if they lose every match. A non-elimination format that is so named because players advance in four to eight different directions depending upon when they lose their first match and when they lose their subsequent matches.

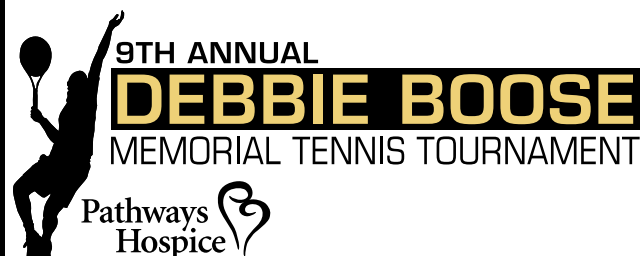

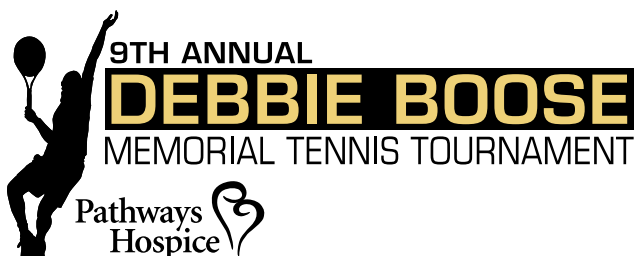

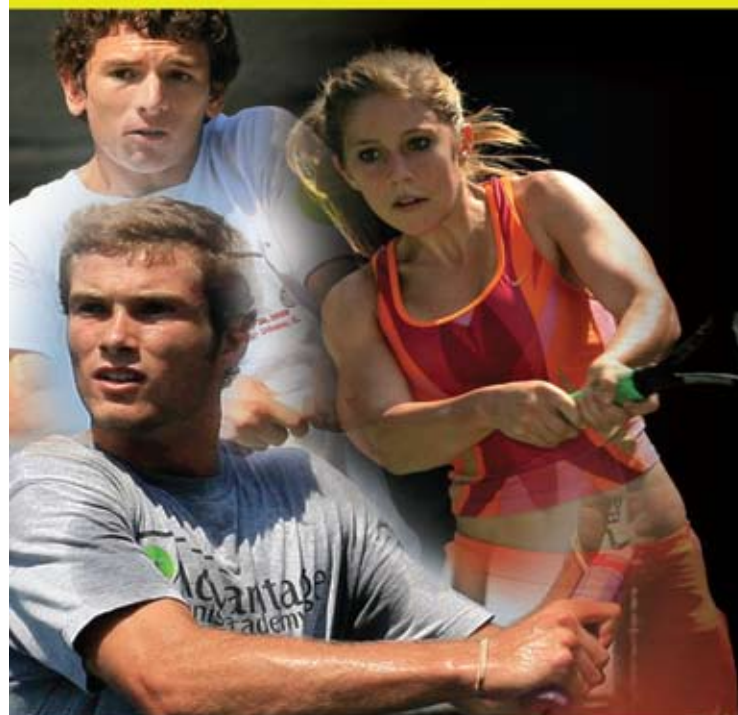

## AT A GLANCE: QUICKSTART TENNIS

QuickStart Tennis is an exciting new play format for learning tennis, designed to bring kids into the game by utilizing specialized equipment, shorter court dimensions and modified scoring, all tailored to age and size. It is divided into two different levels – ages 8 and under and ages 10 and under. It's the fast, fun way to get kids into tennis – and keep them playing.

### GETTING STARTED: EQUIPMENT

Just as kids need a court that suits their size, they also need the right size equipment.

**Racquets:** For players to succeed at tennis, racquet control is essential. Kids need racquets that are proportionate in length and weight and have a grip that fits their smaller hands.

**Balls:** Kids need a ball that's sized and paced to their playing abilities. A regulation tennis ball moves too fast, bounces too high and is too heavy for their smaller racquet. Each age group, therefore, uses a ball better suited to their size and unique playing ability.

## INTRODUCING: QUICKSTART TOURNAMENTS

Kids have more fun with QuickStart than with other approaches to the game because it is real tennis. Instead of pulling at the grass while waiting their turn to hit balls, kids are on the court in an actual match. Real tennis means real competition, and competition means tournaments. QuickStart events don't crown champions or establish rankings, they help kids learn strategy and tactics by actually playing matches. The more matches kids play, the more they learn about the game.

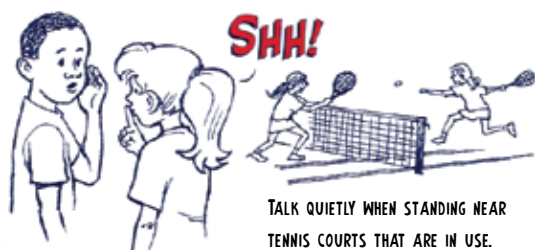

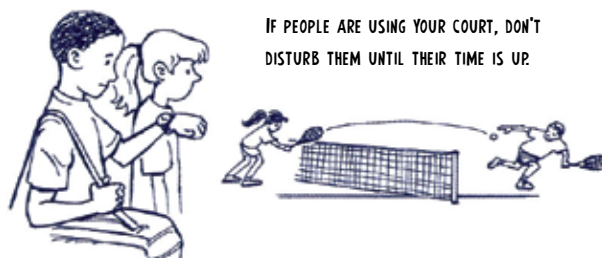
## ABOUT THE CODE:

If you and your opponent follow the rules of tennis and treat each other with respect, you'll both get the most enjoyment from the game, regardless of who wins.

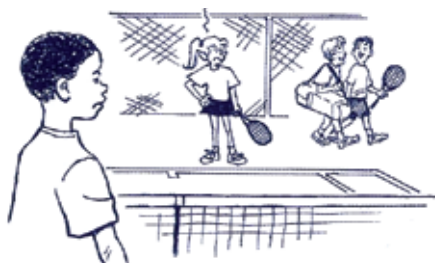


TALK QUIETLY WHEN STANDING NEAR TENNIS COURTS THAT ARE IN USE.

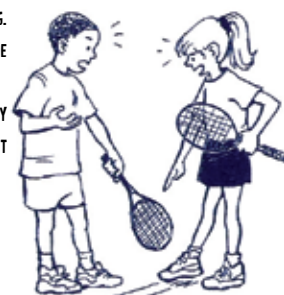


IF PEOPLE ARE USING YOUR COURT, DON'T DISTURB THEM UNTIL THEIR TIME IS UP.
