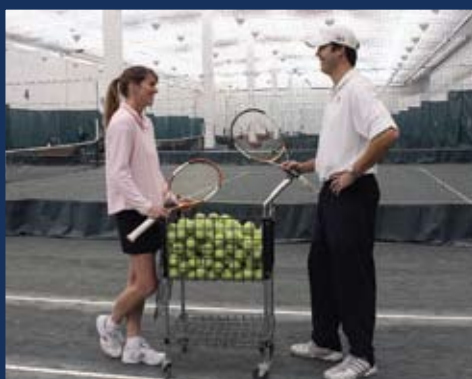

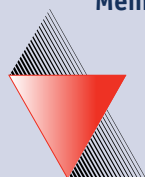

designed to keep Colorado

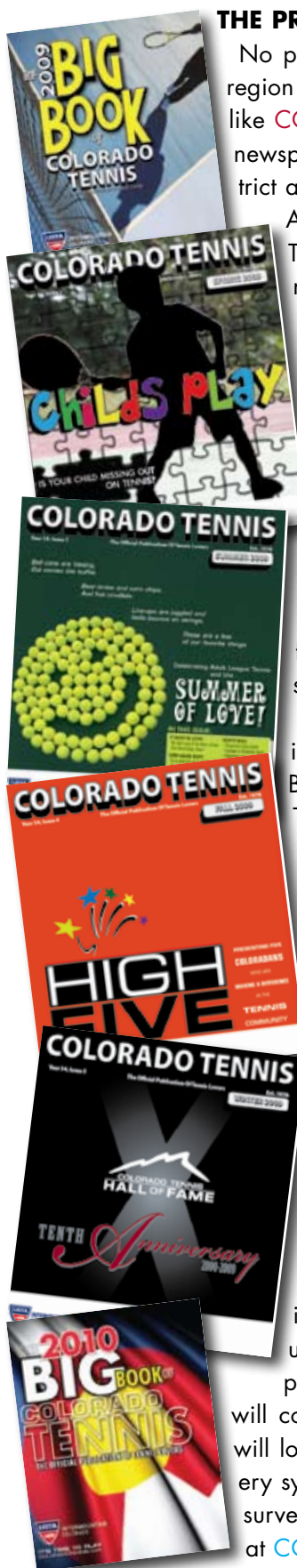

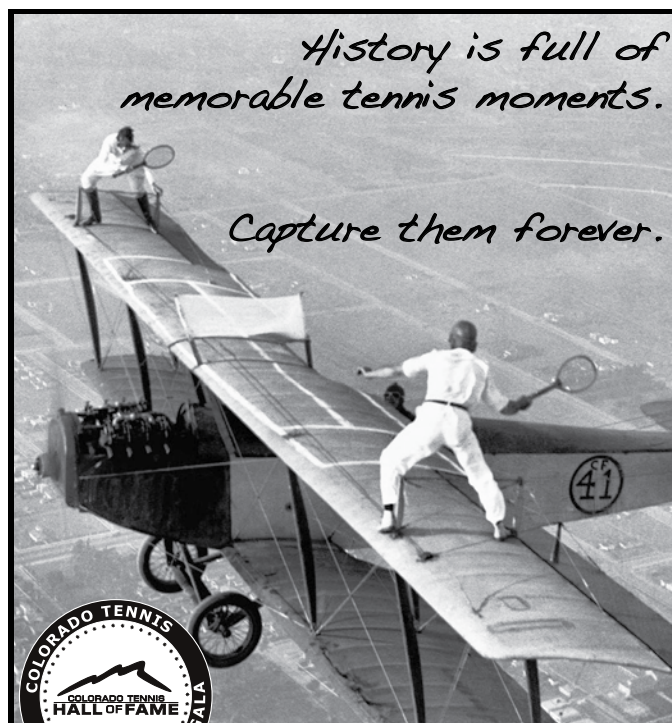
THE PRINTED WORD

BE A TENNIS ADVOCATE. DO YOU HAVE WHAT IT TAKES?

As a fan, player, or supporter of the game of tennis, you know the many benefits of the game.

You know how the sport of tennis can be an important part of improving communities, schools and the quality of life for all.

Are you ready to take your passion for, and knowledge of, tennis and connect it to the needs of communities, schools, colleges and local governments?

Become a Tennis Advocate.

As an advocate, your charge is to persuade decision-makers in the public, private and non-profit sectors of these many benefits in order to gain their support.

Cities, parks, recreation districts and homeowner's associations across the state need local advocates who take action to insure that the growth and maintenance of tennis facilities and programming are top priorities for their community.

ADVOCACY 101

If you are passionate about tennis, you have the requisite background to become a successful tennis advocate. Successful advocacy also requires knowledge, organization and careful planning.

The USTA has put together this step-by-step guide to help potential tennis advocates achieve success in their efforts to grow tennis in their community. Find out more at THEBIGSERVE.USTA.com.

CONCEIVING YOUR PROJECT



Focus on your community, specifically issues affecting kids, youth activities and in-school and extracurricular programs.

Keep it simple.

Don't cloud your message with too many ideas.



Don't spend all your time focused on the end result. Anticipate problems early to avoid them later on. Try to see the situation from an opposing perspective.

STEP

1 Identify an issue/project that resonates with the local community

- What does your community need most?
- Is there a need for youth activities?
- Do the public schools need support?
- Are there local health issues in your area?
- Is there a lack of access to public courts, or do old courts need to be refurbished?
- What do local decision-makers care about?

STEP

2 Develop a clear idea

You should be able to explain your idea or project in a single sentence. If you cannot, the idea is not as clear as it needs to be.

STEP

3 Do your research

Making sure you've covered every angle is critical to the success of your project, so be sure to research the local policy priorities, be prepared to show how tennis-focused programming can benefit your community as a whole, and consider private and public funding options, including grants and fundraising opportunities. Explore the website of your local city or county government for pertinent information related to your project (budgets, master plans, key figures, etc.).

STEP

4 Identify potential obstacles

One of the best things you can do in the early stages is to see where your project may run into problems and then find ways to work around those problems. Being able to anticipate and solve issues in advance will make carrying out your project easier down the road. Try placing yourself in the shoes of your potential opponents and understand their perspective.

STEP

5 Build a strong, broad-based coalition

A coalition is a group of organizations or individuals who work together for a common purpose. By joining with others who have similar priorities, you create a sense that tennis has wide community support. Building a coalition also increases your appeal and creates networking and partnership opportunities between you, your organization and your partner organization.



Additional benefits of a coalition include cost-effectiveness, greater potential to attract media attention, greater access to expertise.

STEP

6 Seek out external allies

Cultivate allies outside tennis, your immediate organization and your coalition. Never rule anyone or anything out. You may be surprised by who wants to help you.



Seek out allies in a variety of areas:

- Chamber of Commerce members
- City council members
- College presidents and trustees
- County Commissioners
- Mayor or local executive
- Planning and zoning commission members
- Park and recreation board members
- State legislators
- School board or committee members

STEP

7 Meeting with decision-makers

You have a focused plan and a network of allies and supporters. It's time to present your project to the local decision-makers for approval and turn dreams into realities.

- Attend city council/school board/park board meetings.
- Contact decision-makers directly for one-on-one meetings.

STEP

8 Executing your advocacy plan

Set intermediate benchmarks for success:

- Focus on achieving a series of short-term wins on the way to a long-term victory.
- Remain focused and vigilant, upbeat and positive.
- Make priorities clear to all.
- Be prepared to answer questions about opposing views in a positive fashion.
- Be polite at all times.
- Stay in consistent communication with:
 - all coalition partners and volunteers
 - local decision-makers
 - the media



You've lined up your allies and your plan is ready to go. It's time to present your project to the person or party that will make the final determination.

FUNDING YOUR PROJECT

Supporting the growth of tennis through program grants, tennis court improvement grants and junior player scholarships, both USTA Colorado and the Colorado Youth Tennis Foundation are committed to making the lifetime sport of tennis more widely available to those who are interested in getting involved and need financial assistance. Applications are due by April 1, with an early 2011 consideration deadline of October 1, 2010.

Organizations offering new and creative approaches to getting more people involved in tennis are encouraged to apply for a program grant. Funding for outreach to diverse communities, adult/senior populations, people with disabilities or youth is available to help offset start-up or expansion expenses such as instructors, equipment, court fees and marketing. Programs must be non-profit in nature and funding

typically ranges between \$100-\$1,000 per program.

Past grant recipient, Big Brothers, Big Sisters of Colorado used grant dollars to offset the cost of court fees and to purchase racquets, balls and hoppers for regular Sports Buddies tennis events. Mike Fye, Sports Buddies Plus Program Specialist for Big Brothers, Big Sisters of Colorado, said "we were able to provide quality tennis instruction by experienced players/instructors at no cost to groups of kids who have had very little, if any, exposure to tennis. They were able to learn tennis in a fun, positive environment with encouragement from their mentors who learned and participated alongside their mentees."

Adopt-A-Court grants provide matching funds for repair and/or renovation of existing public tennis courts in such locations as parks and schools. Up to \$10,000 is available to communities

across Colorado working to ensure quality, safe tennis courts are accessible to everyone.

Adopt-a-Court grant funding awarded to the Easter Seals Colorado camp located outside of Empire, CO contributed to the repair of the unsafe, cracked, net-less court and gave the campers with disabilities and special needs the opportunity to experience the joy of learning to play tennis.

Striving to make a healthy, positive impact across Colorado, USTA Colorado and CYTF financial support helps make it possible.

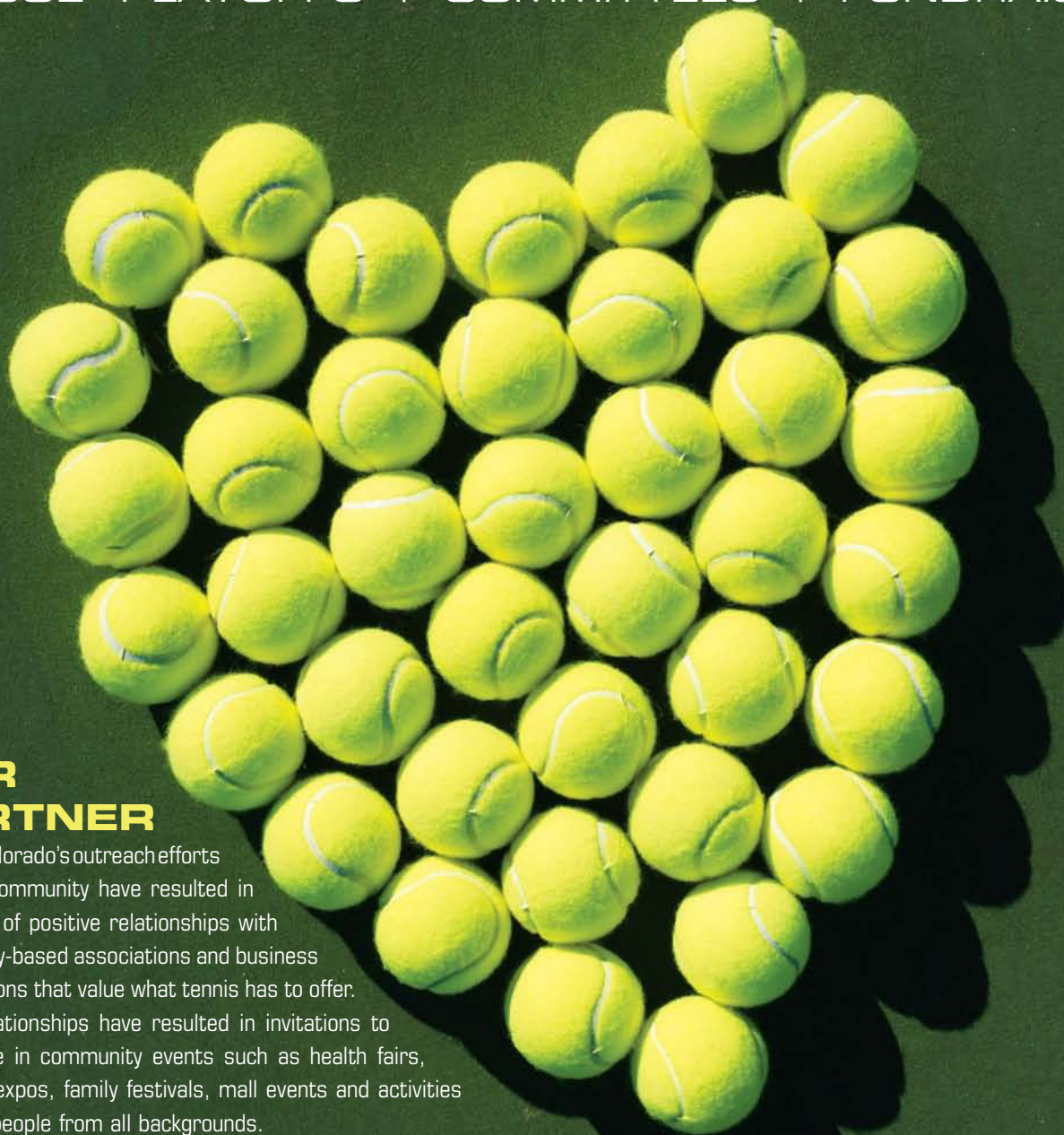

MIDDLE SCHOOL LEAGUES

USTA Colorado is partnering with interested schools and select school districts to offer organized inter-school team play as a part of their after-school programming. Contact USTA Colorado for more information regarding existing programs, or to find out how you can help your school get involved.

DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAMS

TEAM COLORADO A junior excellence program aimed at helping 14-and-under players succeed at the Sectional and National levels, Team Colorado has been home for the state's top juniors for more than 20 years. Team Colorado players are selected in October, with the season running mid-November through mid-spring.

STAR SEARCH Star Search develops, nurtures and promotes the tennis skills of dedicated 8-12 year-olds from diverse backgrounds. A free program for the players, Star Search is a year-round program offering summer sessions at City Park (Denver) and a winter session at Colorado Athletic Club Monaco.

SINGLES LEAGUES

For year-round tennis, the Spring and Fall Singles Leagues give intermediate and advanced junior players (ages 10+) a chance to play singles matches against other players of similar ages and abilities. The two host facilities running the Spring and Fall Singles Leagues are Apex Parks and Recreation (Arvada Tennis Center) and South Suburban Parks and Recreation (Holly Tennis Center). HIGH SCHOOL TENNIS

For many junior players, one of the most exciting experiences they can have is to compete for their high school in interscholastic competition. With more than 7,300 players in 270 Colorado schools participating, players of all abilities still have the opportunity to compete on their high school squads.

TOURNAMENTS

In 2009, more than 7,500 juniors competed in Novice, Satellite and Championship-level events across Colorado.

Youth tournaments offer a wide variety of formats, and accommodate any age or level of player. If your youngster is just learning the game, s/he would be right at home at a **NOVICE** tournament. This year there are more than a dozen Novice and QuickStart events on the tournament calendar. Novice events do not require a USTA membership, and first-time novice players are given a free

membership from USTA Colorado to encourage them to participate in future Satellite and Championship events as they improve their skills. Intermediate-level players with some experience will be right at home in **SATELLITE** tournaments.

More accomplished players and those seeking to compete at the Sectional and National levels will find the toughest competition at the **CHAMPIONSHIP** level of junior tournaments.

SHARE THE GAME



By now you've probably seen the articles about QuickStart Tennis, "the way to play tennis for kids 10 and under". Launched in 2008 by the USTA in partnership with the Tennis Industry Association and professional tennis teachers' associations (PTR and USPTA), QST is positioned as the tennis equivalent to Little League Baseball, with smaller courts, shorter racquets and kid-friendly balls to make the game easier to learn and more fun to play. But changing the way the game has been played for more than a hundred years requires more than just a catchy slogan or glitzy marketing effort.

So when can players and parents expect to see QST programming here in Colorado? This and other Frequently Asked Questions crop up often.

quickstart tennis

We turned to Dan Lewis, Director of Junior Leagues at USTA Colorado, for answers. In addition to coordinating junior programming for more than 5,000 kids across the state, he's responsible for helping to integrate QST into the USTA Colorado junior league offerings.

When will QST be offered in leagues?

There is currently one very small league formerly known as Micro Tennis that is now using the QST format. It is hard to say when there will be more official QST league offerings, but USTA Colorado anticipates offering a QST division in the 10-and-under Junior Team Tennis league in the future. We feel as though it is more important to start small, find out how to be successful, and then integrate it on a larger scale. We will be working with some small facilities – parks and recs and Boys and Girls Clubs – to really train them well and help them generate some steam with this format. We would like to do that for a few years in some different areas and hope that the word spreads like wildfire on how effective this format can be if executed correctly. The hope is that these facilities like it so much that they will begin to have some permanent QST lines painted on their existing courts, blacktops, gyms, etc.

Who is offering "official" QST programs?

The USTA has created an extremely comprehensive guide to QST, where they have outlined six essential specifications for "official" QST programming. USTA Colorado is committed to these specifications and will encourage facilities across the state to follow the guidelines on: age, court size, racquet length, ball weight and speed, net height, and scoring format. We are currently compiling a list of facilities who are offering this "official" QST format, contact our office for more details.

My park/club doesn't offer QST yet, is it okay for my kid to play in a non-QST program?

Yes, it is okay for your kid to play tennis in any format. We are hopeful that someday down the road that this format will become "the norm" for any kid playing tennis in Colorado (and across the U.S.). Like Little League Baseball, kids who are 10-and-under develop better skills and have greater success with racquets, balls and playing surfaces that match their size. We are obviously not at that point yet, but if you find a QST program that is convenient for you, we recommend trying it out. The USTA believes that kids will have more fun and want to continue playing the game if taught under this format, and they will have the potential to progress more quickly as well. Winning and learning is not as important to this age group, but fun "is in." If it's not fun, it's on to the next sport. 🎾

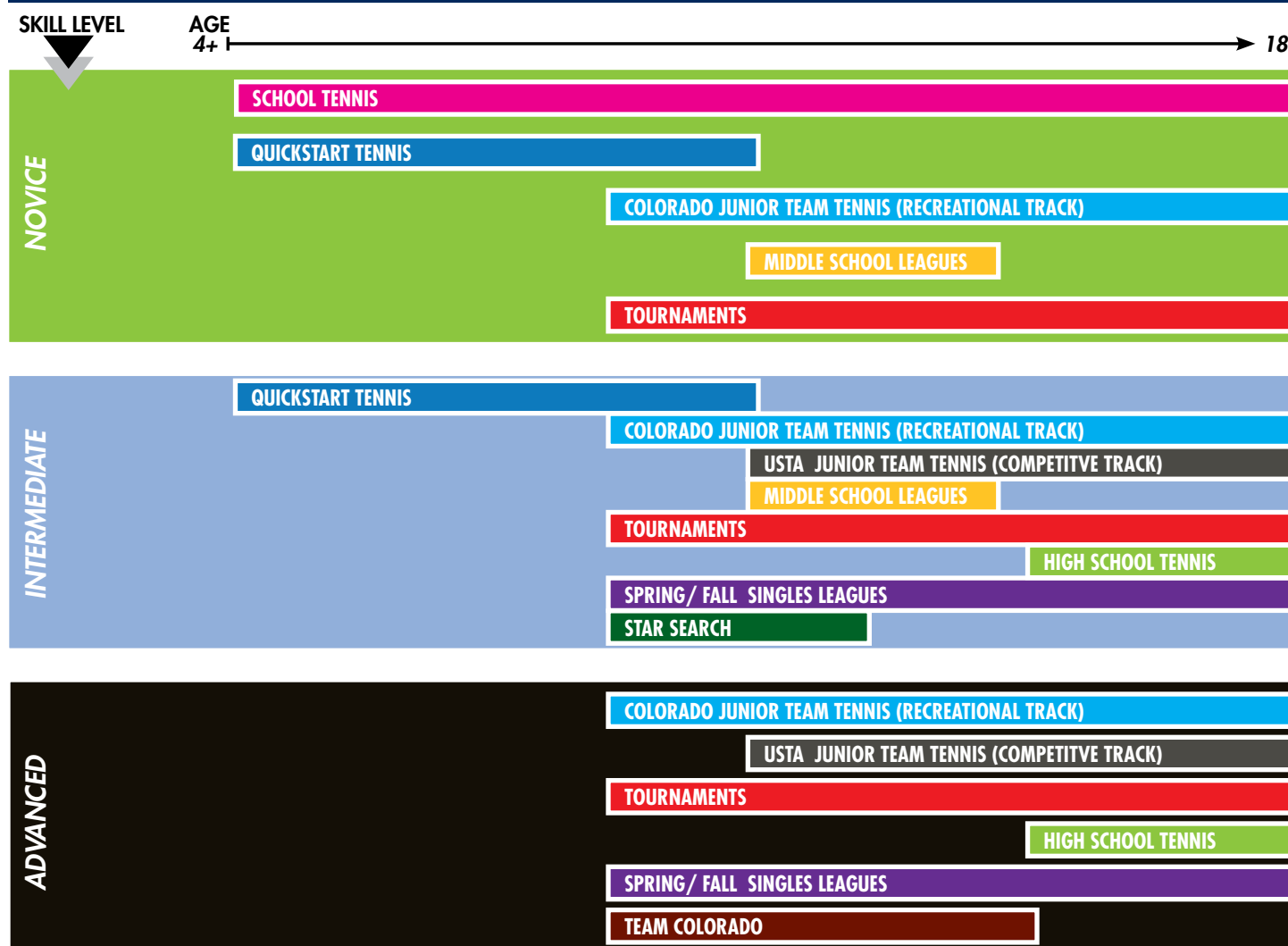

ADULT LEAGUES

LEAGUE TENNIS IS BIG IN COLORADO. HOW BIG? IN 2009, COLORADO'S ADULT LEAGUE DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP WAS THE SEVENTH LARGEST IN THE COUNTRY. AND IN REGULAR SEASON PLAY, ONLY ATLANTA HAD MORE PARTICIPANTS THAN THE DENVER METRO AREA.

BUT IT'S NOT JUST BIG IN SIZE, IT'S IMPACT ON THE GROWTH OF THE SPORT IS MONUMENTAL.



The USTA Colorado Adult League Tennis Series offers one of the nation's largest recreational tennis league menus. The series, which is comprised of nearly a dozen leagues that are open to men and women (age 18 and older) of any ability level, recently wrapped up an incredibly successful 2009 season, as participation grew for the ninth straight year.

League tennis is at the heart of the sport's resurgent popularity. Since 2000, tennis participation has boomed. The latest research by the Sporting Goods Manufacturers Association continues to show impressive news for tennis participation. From 2000 through 2008, tennis was the fastest growing sport in the U.S., increasing participation by 43 percent over every other traditional sport. The only other sports to show participation increases since 2000 are racquetball (up 11.6 percent), soccer (up 2.2 percent) and basketball (1 percent). Every other traditional sport declined in participation, including golf (down 4.3 percent).

In that same nine-year period, adult league growth nationwide has nearly doubled, skyrocketing from 390,000 to 750,000. Here in Colorado, league play has jumped by more than 50% since 2000. In that same period, USTA membership has jumped by nearly 15% here in our state.

These burgeoning numbers are good news for the USTA, which celebrates the 30th Anniversary of the world's largest organized tennis league, USTA League Tennis, in 2010. Since its inception in 1980 – when just 13,000 adults competed across the country – league tennis has grown steadily. Today, nearly three-quarters of a million players compete nationwide in league tennis programs. Fewer than 1,000 Colorado players participated in USTA league tennis in 1980, and in 2009 nearly 28,000 participated throughout Colorado.

The four hallmarks of league tennis have helped fuel the continued popularity of the program for three decades: competition, fun, fitness/health and social. Add to these the fact that players can continue to enjoy all them well into their golden years and you've got a recipe for long-term growth.

Attention team captains looking for new recruits. *Players who are currently 17 (turning 18 by December 31, 2010) can now participate in all adult leagues (tournaments are unaffected).*

While this is a great new option for those players, it would be very unfortunate to have them disqualified for playing too low, so make sure they answer the self-rate questionnaire truthfully and err on the high side of the level they pick.

NTRP GRIEVANCES

NTRP Grievances can now be filed against any self-rated, mixed exclusive or tournament exclusive player.

Contact USTA Colorado if you find a player with one of these rating types who meets the criteria for filing a grievance.

Captains – beware! You do not want to have this happen to one of your players, so be cautious about self-rating and about any players who you know should be at a higher level.

THE 75 PERCENT RULE

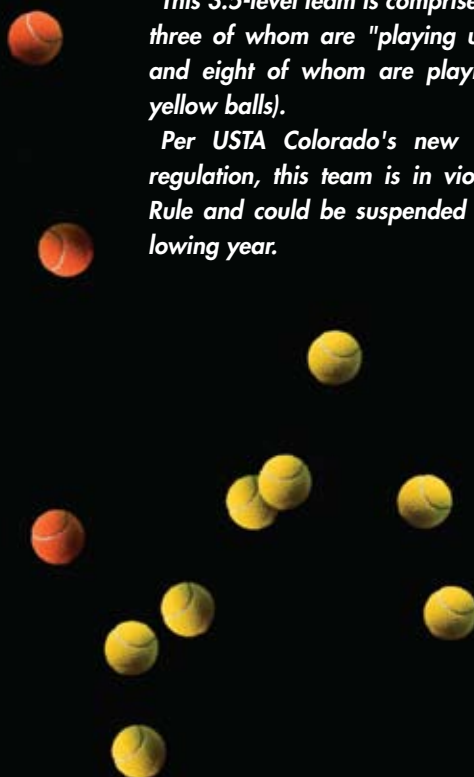
If you are one of the league players who filed a grievance or otherwise suffered through a non-competitive match against players who “play up to challenge themselves”, we have listened. Beginning in 2010, league teams must be comprised of mainly players who are in the correct level (i.e. not playing up). USTA Colorado is instituting a “percent in-level rule” for all leagues (except for USTA Super Senior and both mixed doubles leagues). Every team will be required to have at least 75% of their registered players “in-level.” Penalties for disregarding this regulation could result in teams being suspended from play the following year, so make sure you pay close attention to how many players you have that are “playing up.” See the chart to determine how many players are allowed to play up.

AT A GLANCE: The 75% Rule

This 3.5-level team is comprised of 11 “players”, three of whom are “playing up” (the red balls) and eight of whom are playing “in-level” (the yellow balls).

Per USTA Colorado’s new “percent in-level” regulation, this team is in violation of the 75% Rule and could be suspended from play the following year.

interview with TENNIS magazine, the USTA adjusted the calculations by adding a small percentage point to every player's rating in the 3.0 to 4.5 range, where the majority of league players (87%) are rated. The majority of the bumps were given to men, says Schobel, who historically take a few more liberties with their ratings.

The rationale behind the adjustment wasn't to punish any particular group, says Schobel, it was "to better align [computer ratings] with the written NTRP guidelines." The next effect of the move was to "level the playing field and create a better local league experience for all players."

For those who missed it, here's the article from the summer issue of CT:

NTRP 101: HOW DOES IT WORK?

The primary goal of the program is to help all tennis players enjoy the game by providing a method of classifying skill levels for more compatible matches in league and tournament play, group lessons, and other programs. The rating categories are *generalizations* about skill levels. You may find that you actually play above or below the category which best describes your skill level, depending on your competitive ability. Your rating is not meant to be permanent, but may be adjusted as your skills change or as your match play demonstrates the need for reclassification. Ultimately your rating is based upon match results.

In the summer issue of COLORADO TENNIS newspaper, we took a look at the **National Tennis Rating Program** (NTRP), which made its debut in 1978. This past November, the NTRP system came under fire when the USTA acknowledged that 94,000 league players would be moving up in 2010, nearly double the number of players whose ratings rose in 2008.

According to Dave Schobel, USTA Director of Competitive Play, in an

WHAT THE HECK IS DNTRP?

Dynamic NTRP, or DNTRP, calculates a player's rating based on the result of a single match, and may change with each match played. Your dynamic rating is the result of your current match averaged with up to three of your most recent dynamic results.

Here's how it works (the following examples are for demonstration purposes only, the exact statistical method used by the DNTRP program is known only to the USTA and American Vice President Joe Biden):

1. The program compares the likely result with the actual result. For example, if one player or doubles team has a tenth of a point higher rating than the opponent, the likely match score could be 6-4, 6-4.
 - If the higher rated team wins by a larger than expected margin, each player's rating is increased based on the margin of victory and the losing player's rating is decreased by the same amount;
 - If the higher rated team wins by less than the expected margin, the players' ratings will actually decrease and the losing players' ratings will increase.
 - Likewise, the lower-rated team may win which causes their rating to increase markedly and the rating of the team which was favored would decrease by the same amount.

2. The rating obtained for each player in a given match is averaged with a maximum of their previous three dynamic ratings and that number becomes their new current dynamic rating. *Indirectly this connects the current dynamic to all previous matches but weights the four most recent matches more heavily.* The reason for this averaging is to even out the ratings in cases where some unusual situation causes an atypical result (for example, a player is injured but does not retire, etc.).

3. All player ratings are maintained in the system to the nearest hundredth of a point (sorry, that number is kept in our super-secret underground vault here at Gates, and we lost the key last month).

4. The difference in ratings of the members of a doubles team is held constant in a calculation of an individual match. If the two players are three hundredths (.03) of a point apart going into the match then they will remain three hundredths (.03) apart after the calculation for the given match. *However, once that number is averaged with the three previous dynamic ratings that difference may change.* This is how we measure the performance of players as they change partners.

Disqualification, aka, Three Strikes and You're Out!

Dynamic NTRP ratings will be calculated to determine if any player is "clearly above level" using the current Disqualification Procedure Guidelines. Players will be disqualified if they achieve the currently established 'clearly above level' status three times based on all matches reported in the national database for Adult and Senior Divisions. This includes all match play nationwide in Adult and Senior divisions only. Remember, you must reach this disqualification level three times during the championship league year in order to be disqualified. Only players with a rating type A, S, M, T or D next to their rating can be disqualified by the dynamic disqualification. Rating type C or B cannot be disqualified based on three strikes.

Key to Type of Rating

S – Self-rate or Medical Appeal

A – Appeal

B – Benchmark (advanced to playoff or championship round)

C – Computer

D – Dynamic

M – Mixed Exclusive Year-end Rating

T – Tournament Exclusive Year End Rating

Does the dynamic calculation treat doubles partners differently?

No. Dynamic calculation maintains the rating differential between doubles partners that existed before a match. For example if a 3.3 and a 3.5 player are paired together, spe-

cific match results are applied to each player equally and the two partners will maintain the .2 differential.

Do USTA sanctioned tournaments count toward DNTRP?

And if so, can a tournament win be used as one of the three strikes?

Each section has the option of including tournament results for year-end calculations. Currently, the Intermountain Section includes tournament results for year-end calculations. In this case, sanctioned tournament match scores will not be calculated into the system until after the national championships. Sanctioned tournament results do not generate strikes; however, they will impact your year-end rating. Open/Age Division national tournament results are also entered into the NTRP system after league national championships.

How high can my dynamic rating go before I earn a strike?

The Dynamic NTRP program allows a certain tolerance for player improvement – a greater range for lower-level players where rapid improvement is more likely; a smaller range for higher-level players. The specific improvement factor is not published for concerns that individuals, captains or others will attempt to manipulate their ratings.

Will I be notified if I earn a strike?

No. Notice occurs only after three strikes are accumulated. Many players receive one or two strikes and never get that third. To needlessly worry or prevent a player from participating based on the possibility of getting a strike is not fair to the player or the team.

Can I be disqualified by the dynamic calculation during the District Championships?

Yes. According to USTA Regulations, each section can elect whether to run the dynamic calculation during or after the Championship. The Intermountain Section and all Districts (i.e. Colorado) within the Intermountain Section run the dynamic calculation throughout the championship event. Should a player receive a third strike, he/she will be disqualified from participation at that NTRP level for the balance of the year and the succeeding year:

- Round Robin format: Throughout the championship, any player reaching the DQ criteria will have all matches at that NTRP level reversed to 0-6, 0-6.
- Single Elimination format: Throughout the championship, the last match played by the player at that NTRP level will be reversed to 0-6, 0-6.

ACT YOUR AGE

In order to participate in USTA Colorado's Adult League Tennis Series, players must turn 18 years old by 12/31/2010. USTA Colorado also offers several senior leagues for those who want to "act their age." Players 50+ (or turning 50 by 12/31/2010) are invited to participate in the USTA Senior League, 55+ in the recreational Senior Breakfast League, and 60+ (or turning 60 by 12/31/2010) in the USTA Super Senior League.

FORMATS

Each adult league offers opportunities for players to compete in singles (s), doubles (d), or both (sd). USTA Colorado offers three Combo Doubles leagues: USTA Mixed, USTA Super Senior and ITA Fall Mixed. Levels are determined by combining the partners' NTRP rating. In each of these leagues, the rating spread between partners cannot be greater than 1.0 level (i.e., in a 7.5 level, a 3.0 cannot play with a 4.5). World Team Tennis utilizes a slightly different calculation to determine a team's level. Please contact USTA Colorado for specific details.

THE END OF THE ROAD

Each of USTA Colorado's adult leagues (except Trio and Senior Breakfast League) culminates in a season-ending championship. But certain leagues offer advancement to Sectional and/or National Championships. The easiest way to determine the end point is to look at the prefix of each league: USTA Leagues culminate in a National Championship; ITA Leagues finish up at a Sectional Championship; and CTA leagues end the season at a District (State) Championship. The World Team Tennis league competes in a series of national qualifiers rather than a strict league season, and the Senior Breakfast League offers three seasonal sessions: Spring, Summer and Fall.

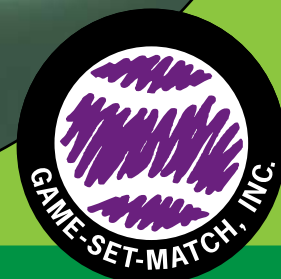

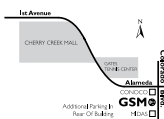

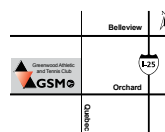

YOUR GUIDE TO PLAYING COLORADO TOURNAMENTS

FINDING THE RIGHT EVENT:

Many factors can help determine the right event for you or your child. Age, skill level, fitness and length of tournament can all be deciding factors in determining which tournaments you should enter. Here's some basic information about the types of events Colorado has to offer:

QuickStart:

QuickStart events offer our youngest players (5-10 years old) the chance to compete in a kid-friendly environment, complete with appropriate-sized equipment, smaller courts and slower-moving balls. For additional information, please see our Guide to the QuickStart Format page 52.

Junior Novice:

Novice events offer juniors the opportunity to experience tournament play and competition in a supportive and non-threatening environment.

Novice players have no previous competitive experience in tournament play (above the novice level), and have typically played tennis for two years or less. Because these events are non-sanctioned, a USTA membership is not required and results do not count towards rankings.

Junior Satellite:

Satellite events offer junior players the opportunity to experience the next level of competitive play. Acting as a bridge between Novice and Championship-level events, Satellite events cater to players with one to three years of beginning competitive experience (i.e., novice tournaments, CARA, novice or intermediate USTA Junior Team Tennis play). Once a player has gained confidence in novice tournaments, or has won a total of three different novice events in any combination of singles, doubles, or mixed, that player can reasonably compete at the Satellite level.

A player is ineligible for the Satellite level play if:

1. Player attained a National or Sectional (Intermountain region) ranking the previous year;
2. Player reached:
 - a) the quarterfinals of a Designated Championship tournament (in-district), or
 - b) the semifinals of any sanctioned Championship tournament event (in-district).

A Satellite Ineligibility List will be published annually based on the prior year's results. The Seeding & Ranking Committee periodically may determine additional players to be ineligible for Satellite level play based on recent Championship or Satellite tournament results. Players are strongly encouraged to play within their age group in the Championship level rather than playing up an age group in the Satellite level. The Seeding and Ranking Committee will consider written

appeals from players for the Satellite ineligible list until April 13, 2010.

Junior Championship:

The Championship level is designed for the junior player who is seeking the highest level of junior competition in Colorado. Satellite players who are seeking more advanced tournament play may also compete at this level.

Players listed on the 2010 Satellite Ineligible List – published on COLORADOTENNIS.com in March 2010 – are required to play at this level. Juniors seeking to compete at the Sectional and National levels are encouraged to compete in Championship-level events.

NTRP Events:

Designed to pit players of compatible skill against one another. NTRP levels range from 2.5 to 5.0 **Note: players rated above 5.0 are required to play in the Open division; any junior player 18 & under MUST play in the Open division, unless the player turns 19 by December 31, 2010. They are then eligible to compete in an NTRP event, but must contact the Tournament Director for entry.**

You may play at or above your specific NTRP level, but not below your rating. If you don't have a current rating, you may self-rate and play in that division. For information on NTRP ratings, see COLORADOTENNIS.com.

Senior/Family Events:

Also called age division events, Senior events pit players 30 and older against similarly aged competitors. In Family events, the only requirement is that the partners be related (there are no upper or lower age limits). But be aware: there are no skill parameters in Senior or Family events. A player in the draw may be an expert, a novice, or anywhere in between. **Players must be of division age by December 31, 2010, and may not play in an older division.**

Unless otherwise noted, all Colorado sanctioned events utilize TennisLink, the USTA's online registration system. To register, visit USTA.com and click the TennisLink tab, or go to COLORADOTENNIS.com and click Tournaments under the Helpful Links drop-down menu. Use the TennisLink number provided in this publication for easy reference.

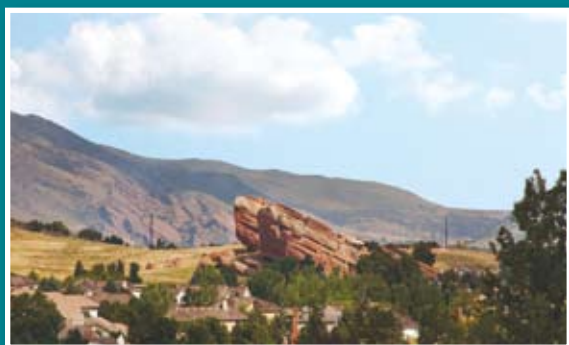
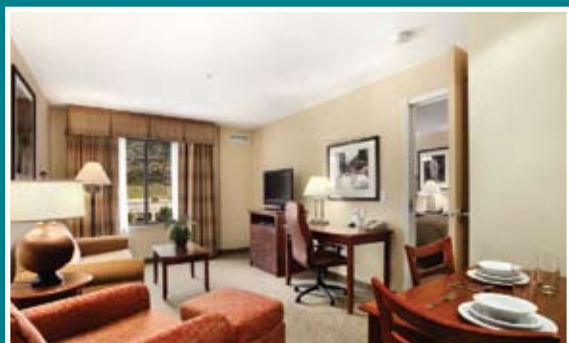

COLORADO TOURNAMENT 2010 RANKINGS REQUIREMENTS

In Colorado, all Senior, NTRP, Championship, Family events, and Junior Satellite tournaments utilize a Points Per Round (PPR) system to determine Colorado rankings. If you're unfamiliar with PPR, it is a very simple process. Players earn points for each win, plus earn bonus points for wins over "Top 20" players. Sanctioned events are broken down to Designated/Level 1 and non-Designated/Level 2 tournaments (see chart below). Level 1 tournaments carry more points than Level 2 events.

The USTA Colorado Ranking Review Committee reserves the right to modify the ranking requirements if deemed necessary or appropriate.

No changes have been made to any ranking requirements for 2010.

NTRP SINGLES/DOUBLES REQUIREMENTS:

Players accumulating a minimum of 250 points during the calendar year will earn a year-end ranking. Only a player's three best results* at Colorado sanctioned events will count towards a ranking.

SENIOR (30-80)/FAMILY REQUIREMENTS:

Players accumulating a minimum of 100 points during the calendar year will earn a year-end ranking. Only a player's two best results at Colorado sanctioned events* will count towards a ranking.

CHAMPIONSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

Players accumulating a minimum of 200 points during the calendar year will earn a year-end ranking. Only a player's two best results at Colorado sanctioned events* will count towards a ranking.

JUNIOR SATELLITE REQUIREMENTS:

Players accumulating a minimum of 150 points during the calendar year will earn a year-end ranking. Only a player's three best results* at Colorado sanctioned events will count towards a ranking.

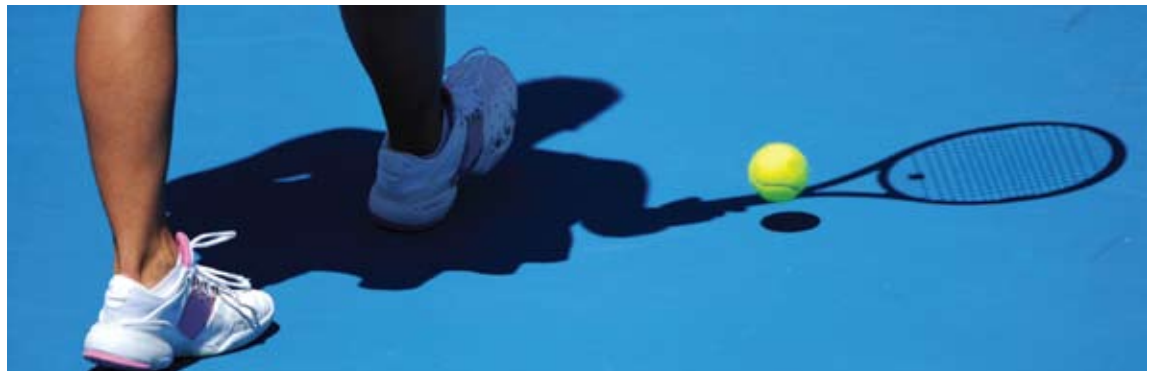

THE LIST 9 THINGS EVERY COLORADO TOURNAMENT PLAYER SHOULD KNOW

GETTING "HELP" AT COLORADOTENNIS.com:

Not to be biased, but our search features are infinitely simpler and more accurate than the USTA's TennisLink. Hit COLORADOTENNIS.com and use the "Helpful Links" drop-down menu. Click "Find a Tourney". You can search by tournament name, or division. You can also look for tournaments in progress, those open for registration and completed tournaments. And Finding the tournament site has never been easier. Click "Find a Court", type in the name of the facility and voila. It's like having an **EASY BUTTON**.

VERIFY ALL TOURNAMENT INFORMATION ONLINE

Players are encouraged to verify all tournament information online. The information provided in the 2010 Big Book is accurate at the time of publication, but is not complete. Get draw times, weather announcements, schedule changes, directions, etc. You will find other important information online as well, like what time the player party starts and what size t-shirt you can order. It is the players' responsibility to obtain and verify all match times. Check the event's online listing two days prior to the start of the event, or verify with tournament staff.

KEEP YOUR INFORMATION CURRENT WITH THE USTA

In addition to ensuring that you'll receive your Big Book and other vital *Colorado Tennis* publications, keeping the USTA up to date on your contact info is very helpful to tournament directors in case they need to reach you for any reason during an event (Rain Delay, Default, etc.)

CHECKING YOUR STANDING

You're not vain, you just want to see where you stand in your division. Just go to COLORADOTENNIS.com and use the "Helpful Links" menu to access division standings.

SEEDING/FORMATS

Seedings for Colorado events reflect the most current published Standing Lists. If Joe Smith is #1 in Men's 4.0 singles, he will be seeded #1 in that event. Also, please note that a tournament director and/or committee can alter the schedule or scoring format due to inclement weather or size of the tournament.

HEY, THAT KID ISN'T OLD ENOUGH TO PLAY NTRP!

Any player who is 18 years-old, but will be turning 19 by Dec. 31, 2010, is eligible to participate in Adult NTRP events. But there's a catch for 18s who want to register for an event: TennisLink is not set up to accommodate you, so you must contact the tournament director to register for the event. They will happily enter you into the draw.

CHECKING IN

Please *plan to arrive at your tournament site at least 15 minutes prior to your first match*. This can help in getting matches on earlier if courts are available and is very much appreciated by tournament staff.

WARMING UP ON TOURNAMENT DAY

Not many events boast open courts during the tournament, so any warm-up prior to a match should be done at a different location. Use the Court Locator at COLORADOTENNIS.com to find public courts near the site to warm-up prior to your match.

COME PREPARED WITH THE ESSENTIALS

Don't assume all sites have water on the courts. Come prepared with plenty of fresh water, a hat and sunscreen, especially for those hot summertime matches. Players of all levels should come prepared to every match with at least two freshly strung tennis racquets.

MODIFIED FORMATS

FMLC: *First Match Losers Consolation* – A draw in which the first-round losers and second round losers who advanced to that round by virtue of a bye or default enter the consolation draw.

FRLC: *First Round Losers Consolation* – A draw in which only the first-round losers enter the consolation draw.

MFIC: *Modified Feed-In Consolation* – A draw in which the main draw losers are fed back into another draw against players who lost in earlier rounds of the tournament.

ROUND ROBINS – Multiple match guarantees as players compete against all other players in their flight.

COMPASS DRAWS – Player-friendly formats guaranteeing players multiple matches, even if they lose every match. A non-elimination format that is so named because players advance in four to eight different directions depending upon when they lose their first match and when they lose their subsequent matches.

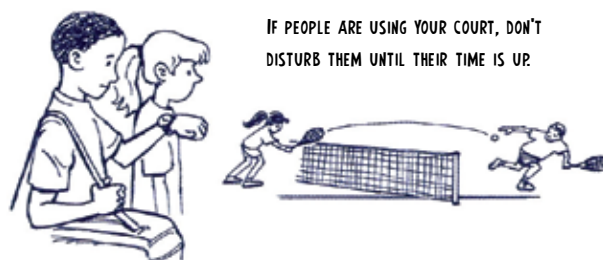
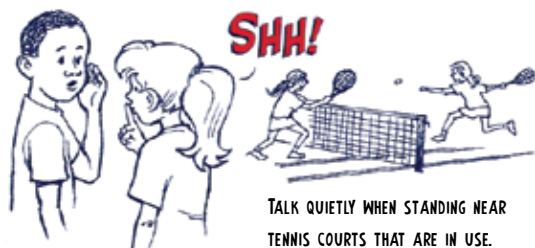

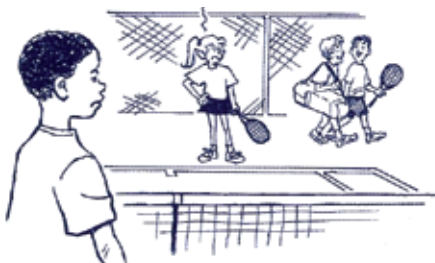
ABOUT THE CODE:

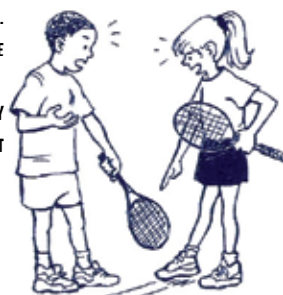
If you and your opponent follow the rules of tennis and treat each other with respect, you'll both get the most enjoyment from the game, regardless of who wins.



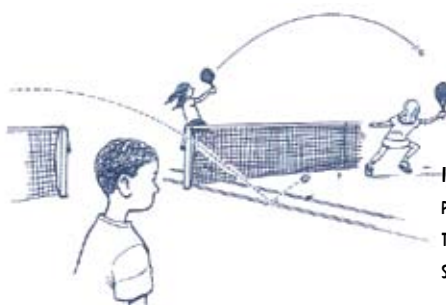

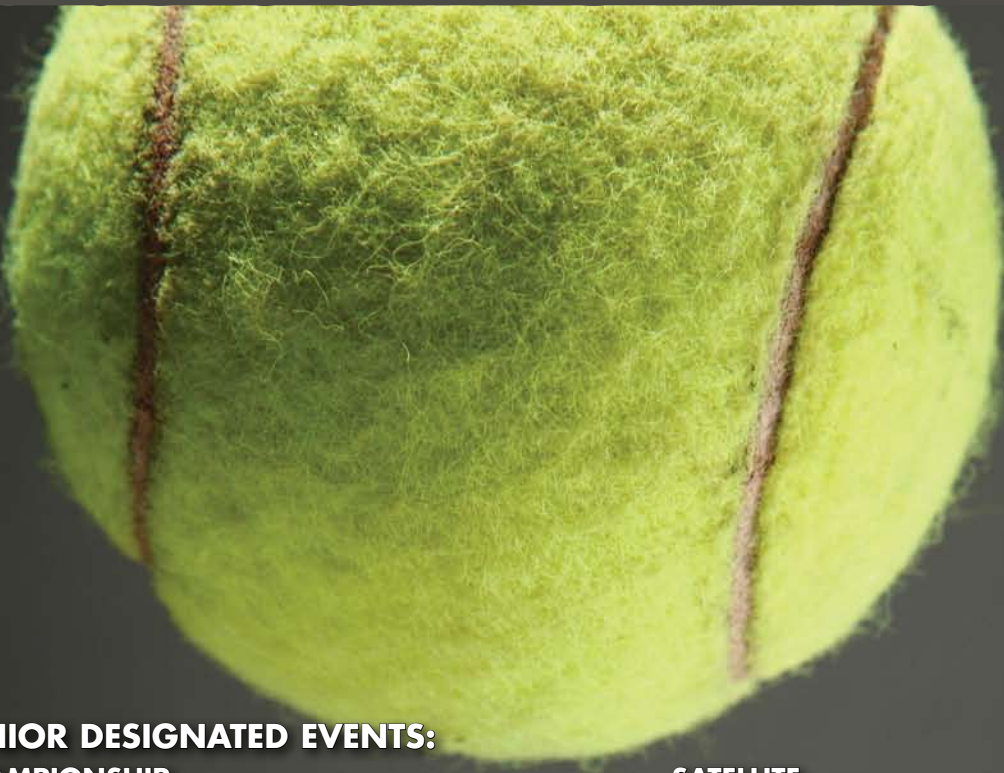

AT A GLANCE: QUICKSTART TENNIS

QuickStart Tennis is an exciting new play format for learning tennis, designed to bring kids into the game by utilizing specialized equipment, shorter court dimensions and modified scoring, all tailored to age and size. It is divided into two different levels – ages 8 and under and ages 10 and under. It's the fast, fun way to get kids into tennis – and keep them playing.

GETTING STARTED: EQUIPMENT

Just as kids need a court that suits their size, they also need the right size equipment:

Racquets: For players to succeed at tennis, racquet control is essential. Kids need racquets that are proportionate in length and weight and have a grip that fits their smaller hands.

Balls: Kids need a ball that's sized and paced to their playing abilities. A regulation tennis ball moves too fast, bounces too high and is too heavy for their smaller racquet. Each age group, therefore, uses a ball better suited to their size and unique playing ability.

INTRODUCING: QUICKSTART TOURNAMENTS

Kids have more fun with QuickStart than with other approaches to the game because it is real tennis. Instead of pulling at the grass while waiting their turn to hit balls, kids are on the court in an actual match. Real tennis means real competition, and competition means tournaments. QuickStart events don't crown champions or establish rankings, they help kids learn strategy and tactics by actually playing matches. The more matches kids play, the more they learn about the game.

KEY ELEMENTS FOR QUICKSTART TOURNAMENTS:

- 1) Proper sized court (i.e. 36'x18' or 60'x20') depending on age
- 2) Proper ball for the age division (5 & 6 yr-olds = foam ball; 7 & 8 yr-olds = foam or low compression/red colored; 9 & 10 yr-olds = low compression/orange balls)
- 3) Proper net (short court net for 36' court, traditional net for 60' court)
- 4) Proper racquets (19, 21, 23" for 36' court). *Extra racquets will be available for players without the right sized racquet.*
- 5) Scoring System (based on USTA guidelines for each respective age division)
- 6) Age Divisions (broken into three separate divisions: 5-6, 7-8, 9-10)
- 7) Non-elimination formats (i.e. round robin or compass draw). Kids play multiple matches (minimum of three). *Note: the tournament director can still configure draws to determine a winner and runner-up for the tournament.*
