RULECHANGES2013

The Official Handbook of Tennis Rules and Regulations (including The Code), **FRIEND AT COURT** is an essential piece of equipment for every tennis player. The 2013 edition is now available, and includes the most recent Rules, Regulations and Code changes. 2013 FRIEND AT COURT – RULE CHANGE HIGHLIGHTS

Question: How much rest between singles matches is a Junior player entitled to after playing singles outdoors with a match format of the best of three tie break sets?

Answer: Two hours. Recovery Rule in USTA Regulations, Table 11 (page 104) — After all singles matches in Junior, Adult, Senior, NTRP and Wheelchair Divisions in which the match format is two out of three standard tie break sets or more, the Referee shall offer a rest of two hours before the player's next singles match. This rule does not apply to short set matches, matches that play a tiebreak in lieu of a final third set, nor any match played indoors where the duration of the match is less than 120 minutes.

Question: What may a player who has broken a string or racket do if the player does not have a replacement racket?

Answer: ITF Rules of Tennis, USTA Comment 4.2 (page 6) — Unless prohibited by a published rule adopted by the tournament, the player may play with the broken racket. The player may ask someone else to get a replacement racket. The player may leave the court to get a replacement racket. If the player leaves the court, the player is subject to code violations for delays under the Point Penalty System.

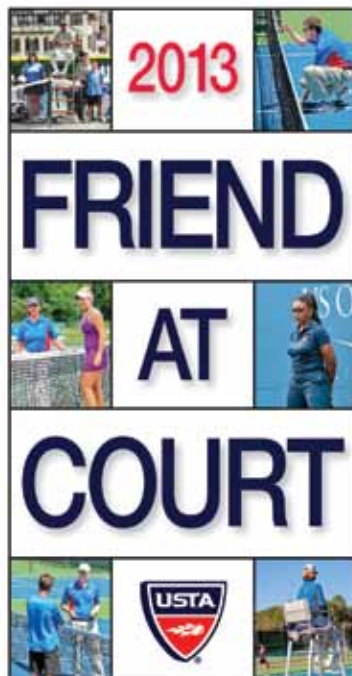
Question: When may a player leave the court?

Answer: USTA Regulations -- Player Responsibilities & Conduct (page 116) — A player may leave the court to retrieve a ball. A player shall obtain permission from an official to leave the court. If a player is unable to contact an official, a player may leave the court: 1) to contact an official; 2) for a toilet/change of attire break; 3) to obtain water on a changeover or set break when none is available on court; or 4) to repair or replace broken clothing, shoes, or necessary equipment other than the racket

Question: Should the Referee make reasonable effort to give comparable rest to winners of matches who will play each other in the next round?

Answer: Yes. USTA Regulations, FAC Comment II.D-2 (page 95) — The Referee's primary way of providing comparable rest is the scheduling of matches in the same section of the draw to start about the same time. When possible the Referee should also coordinate the scheduling of the main draw matches with the corresponding match in the Feed-in Championship.

KIDS & TENNIS: A NATURAL FIT

Tennis is one of the most popular sports in the United States and is the second most-played sport worldwide.

Free or low-cost courts are available in nearly every community at schools and parks, and organized programs for kids are common throughout the country. All a child needs to get started is a racquet and some tennis balls. The cost of an introductory racquet and balls is extremely reasonable so the starting expense of playing tennis is among the lowest of any sport.

Tennis provides children with a place they can go and be independent, meet friends and be active. It also provides kids with a way of meeting new friends whenever they move to a new area. Whether it is moving to a new school or to a new home, the local tennis court will always provide great social opportunities.



TENNIS SHOULD BE A GAME BEFORE IT BECOMES A SPORT

DEVELOPING A LOVE OF THE GAME

It is important to keep participation in youth sports in perspective and to understand why kids play. Many times adults have grand ideas of a professional career or even a college scholarship. While these could be long-term goals for those players who eventually specialize in a sport, children play for different reasons. They want to be active, be with friends, develop skills and, most importantly, have fun.

- 28,000 boys and girls were asked in a study about why they played sports:
1. Fun
 2. To do something I am good at
 3. To improve my skills
 4. To stay in shape.

Guess what? Winning did not even make the Top 10! If tennis is not fun, or if there is little activity, your child is unlikely to develop a love of the game and will instead find another activity that is more compelling.

Long-term goals include the enjoyment of an activity they can play for a lifetime. It is a game kids can play with friends and family. Tennis is a fantastic way to spend quality time as a family.

Be aware of putting pressure on children for results, but make sure you recognize and acknowledge effort. In the US, **70 percent of kids quit organized sport by the age of 13**, and the top three reasons given by kids are:

1. It's not fun anymore
2. Parent/coach pressure to perform
3. No longer interested in the sport

Parents must let kids be kids and let them play and discover. Let them have fun. Provide opportunities for them to be with friends. Permit them to play spontaneously, to experiment and to risk. Allow them to challenge each other to learn new skills and try new shots. Make tennis that haven where they can get away from their over-structured lives and learn to move, play and create on the tennis court.

PLAY OPPORTUNITIES

There is a starting point for every child who is introduced to tennis. The first experience might be on a playground with friends, or it may be in the driveway with a parent or family member. Really, it could be in any number of settings—at school during physical education class, during recess, or in a before- or after-school program. Many youth program providers also offer tennis, generally in after-school or summer programs, and introductory tennis classes are common in most communities in Colorado and are typically offered by parks, camps or clubs.

However it happens, once your child has that first experience and develops a perceived level of ability—the thought that, “Hey, I can do this”—it is important to identify opportunities for your child to participate. Your child has several options when they begin the sport, and it's important that they are given opportunities to develop at their own pace and participate in events with other kids of similar ability levels. Here are several possibilities that are all great for kids.

SUPERVISED PLAY

Supervised play can be offered anywhere in which courts are made available for kids to use under the direction of an adult. The role of the adult is to serve as the “gatekeeper” and provide a safe area in which everyone has an opportunity to play. Similar to an “open gym” for basketball or an “open pool” for swimming, these opportunities are ideal for schools, youth centers and neighborhoods where kids can meet up and enjoy the camaraderie of playing with one another.

One such opportunity for supervised play is a **Tennis Festival**, which are free events that provide an exciting and entertaining opportunity for kids to experience what tennis can offer. They offer a variety of tennis activities, interactive games and contests that appeal to a wide range of ages and skill levels. In addition to introducing tennis to the kids and teaching them about the game, Tennis Festivals offer parents the opportunity to learn how to get their kids involved in a local program. Call your local parks & recreation department or community association to see if there are any introductory tennis festivals that your child can participate in.

Kids' Tennis Clubs are offered at local schools, parks, youth centers and tennis facilities. This format lets kids “sample” the sport in a social and group environment. The Kids Tennis Club is structured like an organized extracurricular activity. These clubs offer kids the opportunity to have fun, gain confidence and meet new friends all while enhancing their social, educational and physical development. If a Kids Tennis Club isn't offered in the local community, parents should encourage local youth-serving organizations to add tennis to their curriculum.

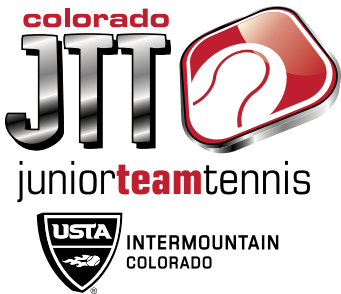
Play Days are designed to give kids additional court time in a fun, low pressure, non-elimination setting where they can continue to develop and enhance their skills. For both novices and more experienced players, Play Days are a welcoming and fun way for kids to experience the social and competitive aspects of tennis. Organized by skill level, Play Days afford kids the chance to gain additional play experience by rotating opponents through short, continuous matches over a 2-3 hour period. STRUCTURED PLAY AND COMPETITION

As children develop an interest in tennis, finding an organized event or program is a great way to improve their skills and provide further development through lessons, clinics and additional play opportunities. Much depends on the commitment to practice and play, but that can be determined with the help and guidance of the parent. There are recreational and competitive opportunities across the state starting with entry-level tournaments (FUTURES) and junior leagues (COLORADO JUNIOR TEAM TENNIS) that your child can enjoy.

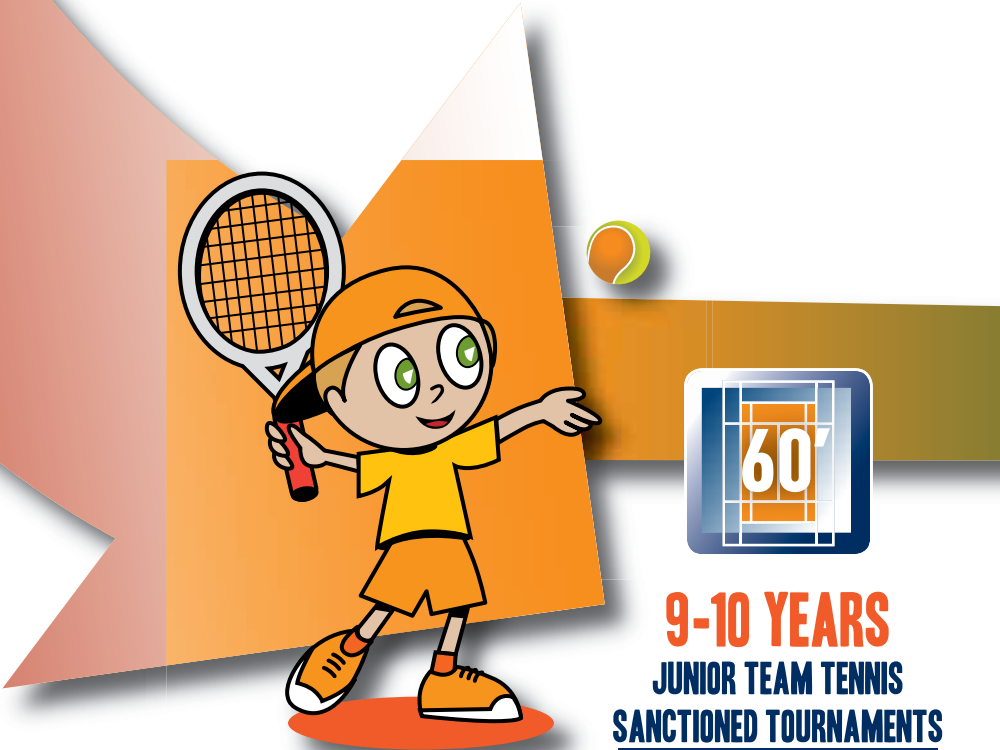

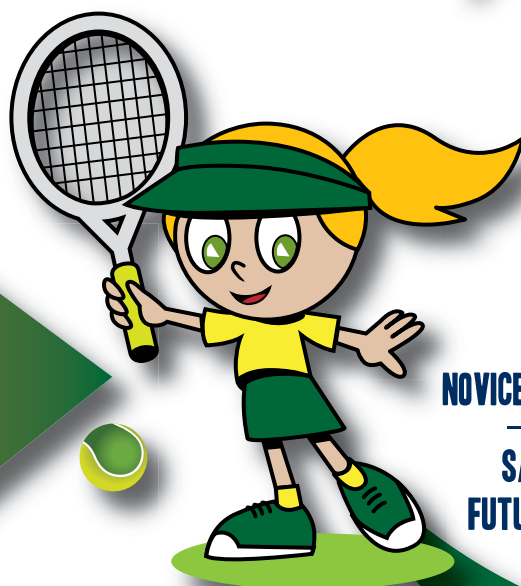

8 AND UNDER

Kids need a tennis ball that is sized and paced to their playing abilities. A standard yellow tennis ball moves too fast, bounces too high and is too heavy for their smaller racquet. With 10 and Under Tennis, each age group uses a tennis ball better suited to its size and unique playing ability.



RED FOAM / RED FELT BALL:

Red foam or felt balls move 75% slower through the air, bounce lower and travel less distance.

Can you imagine sending your child out to play baseball for the first time on a full-size field, with the same size bat and ball they use in the major leagues? Of course not. Yet in previous years young players have done just that in tennis, taking an adult-sized racquet and a yellow tennis ball to play on the same-sized court as is used at the US Open.



THE RIGHT COURT – 18'X36':

Young players better develop an all-court game when they can cover the whole court. A 6-year-old takes a 19" stride, while the average adult stride is nearly 30".

Adult racquets are too unwieldy for young players; they are too long and heavy and the grips are too large. An appropriately sized racquet, one designed for kid-sized hands and strength, is essential. As a general rule of thumb, have your child stand with both arms falling naturally down at his sides. When the child holds a properly sized racquet in one hand, the head of the racquet will just touch the floor.



THE RIGHT TOOL – 19" to 23"

What better way to help kids get a grip on tennis than with the right sized racquet? A kid-sized racquet weighs 6oz, while an adult racquet weighs more than double that!



Kids need a tennis ball that is sized and paced to their playing abilities. A standard yellow tennis ball moves too fast, bounces too high and is too heavy for their smaller racquet. With 10 and Under Tennis, each age group uses a tennis ball better suited to its size and unique playing ability.



ORANGE BALL:

Orange low-compression balls move a bit faster and travel slightly farther than the red ball, but only about half the speed and distance of a standard yellow ball.

Can you imagine sending your child out to play baseball for the first time on a full-size field, with the same size bat and ball they use in the major leagues? Of course not. Yet in previous years young players have done just that in tennis, taking an adult-sized racquet and a yellow tennis ball to play on the same-sized court as is used at the US Open.



THE RIGHT COURT – 21'x60' / 27'x60':

Young players better develop an all-court game when they can cover the whole court. Kids ages 9-10 learn by playing, developing a tactical understanding of the game.

Adult racquets are too unwieldy for young players; they are too long and heavy and the grips are too large. An appropriately sized racquet, one designed for kid-sized hands and strength, is essential. As a general rule of thumb, have your child stand with both arms falling naturally down at his sides. When the child holds a properly sized racquet in one hand, the head of the racquet will just touch the floor.



THE RIGHT TOOL – 23" to 25"

What better way to help kids get a grip on tennis than with the right sized racquet? Lighter than an adult racquet by nearly 30%, these racquets help youngsters develop proper swing habits and confidence.

**GREEN BALL:**

At 14% lighter and 25% softer than a standard-compression ball, the green ball is the right ball for players who are moving up to a full-size court but not yet ready for the speed or density of a traditional ball.

NEW FOR 2013:

Did you know that since 2008, competitors in the men's draw of the US Open play with a different ball than in the women's draw? The extra duty felt that the men play with helps to slow the ball down just a fraction while the women's ball is designed to speed up the game.

If the principle works at the highest professional level, surely it isn't such a bad idea when it comes to helping 11 and 12 year olds develop confidence in their strokes and getting them to enjoy the game a bit more.

Whether a youngster is just entering the sport (novice) or s/he is developing skills as an intermediate player, the use of a low compression ball makes all the difference between having fun—or not—and developing proper technique—or not. A softer ball means players can compete using greater racquet head speed on shots, balls are easier to track down due to slower speeds, and points last longer as players gain confidence and develop patience and consistency.

USTA Colorado's goal is to create a pathway that enhances skill develop-

ment in a fun and active setting which will facilitate the objective of attracting thousands of youngsters to our sport.

To that end, USTA Colorado mandated the Green ball for the Junior Team Tennis 12s Novice division in 2012. After its successful debut, the Green ball will become the new standard for both JTT 12s Intermediate divisions (IA/IB). We will also be utilizing the same ball in the tournament arena for the 12s Futures (novice) and 12s Challenger (intermediate) divisions. The addition of the Green Ball to the tournament line-up will especially benefit those players who are progressing from the Orange ball/60-foot court stage and are transitioning to a full-size court.

A handful of parents and coaches of talented juniors may complain that a Green ball is a "step backward" from "real" tennis, but the benefits of playing with a slower, softer ball will far outweigh the drawbacks. And for those highly skilled 12s, play will continue with the yellow high compression ball in the Championship (advanced) division.

STANDARD HIGH-ALTITUDE BALL:

The standard yellow ball for all sanctioned play across Colorado is engineered to bounce 53-58 inches high when dropped from a height of 100 inches. At a diameter of 2.575-2.700 inches, the traditional ball weighs in at around 2 ounces and comes in multiple felt densities designed for a variety of court surfaces.














Players competing in the 12s Advanced (JTT) and 12s Championship (Sanctioned Tournaments) divisions are not just adept at covering a larger court, but they are also confident, consistent and well-developed shot makers. They have already begun to employ advanced strategy and are comfortable with a traditional ball that carries heavy spin, bounces higher and travels at a greater rate of speed than any of the low-compression balls.

All 12s divisions at Sectional, Regional and National tournaments employ the traditional yellow ball.

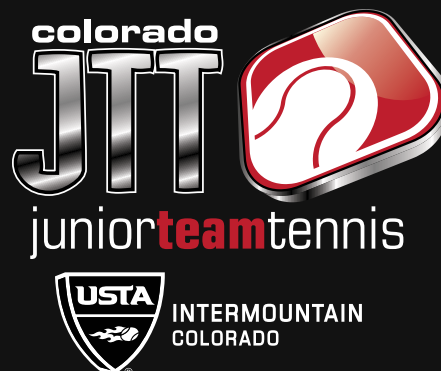

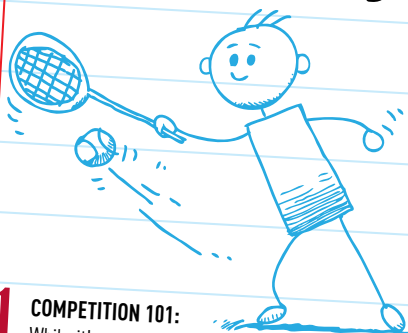

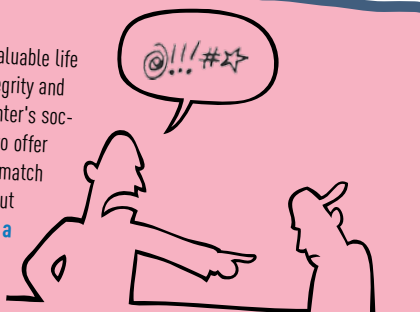


1 COMPETITION 101:

While it's unreasonable to expect even a seasoned player to know all 300+ pages of the Official Rules of Tennis plus the 50-odd pages of The Code, it is extremely important that **all players know the basics of tennis etiquette and scoring.**

2 SPECTATING 101:

Tennis teaches many valuable life lessons, like self-reliance, integrity and problem-solving. As your daughter's soccer coach, it may be tempting to offer helpful suggestions during the match about strategy and technique, but **coaching is forbidden during a tennis match.** Keep all comments positive and supportive of both players. Winning a tennis match is hard enough; players don't need the additional pressure of spectators voicing their frustrations or offering "assistance" during the match.



5 GETTING "HELP" AT COLORADOTENNIS.com:

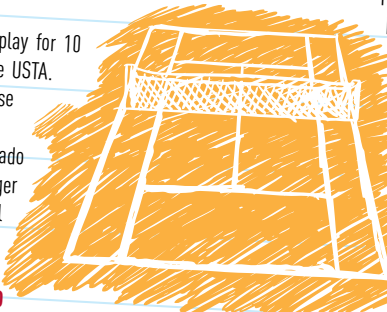
6 RESOLVING JTT CONFLICTS:

Junior Team Tennis and tournament play are great companions, and young players are encouraged to do both. Any Junior Team Tennis players who discovers scheduling conflicts with a local tournament should contact the Tournament Director immediately. Directors are required to accommodate the player if the match falls on a Monday during the Junior Team Tennis league season.



3 THE RULES HAVE CHANGED:

On January 1, 2012, the rules governing play for 10 and Under sanctioned events were modified by the USTA. New in 2013, USTA Colorado has mandated the use of the **GREEN** ball for most 12 and Under events. Affected divisions are 12 Intermediate A/B in Colorado Junior Team Tennis, and the 12s Futures and Challenger divisions in all sanctioned Colorado tournaments. All 10 and Under divisions are still required to use the **ORANGE** ball on a 60-foot court, and all sanctioned 8s play will be done on a 36-foot court with the **RED** ball.



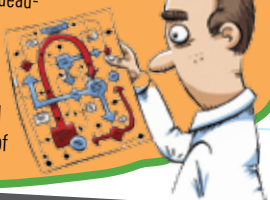
7 FINDING THE RIGHT EVENT:

There are more than 100 junior events listed in the 2013 Big Book of Colorado Tennis. Figuring out which tournament to play can be intimidating. Be sure to take a quick look at the Junior Pathway (page 18). That's a good place to start. Once you've determined a starting point, jump to the corresponding section for **RED/ORANGE/GREEN/YELLOW** balls. There you'll find a detailed description of different events and levels of play.

4 UNDERSTANDING THE TOURNAMENT SCHEDULE:

Each tournament listing contains detailed information about the type of event, format, dates and deadlines, contact info and a registration number.

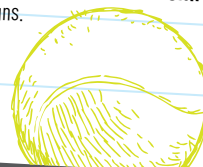

8 WHAT'S IN A NAME:

Any parent or young player who has grown accustomed to the Colorado junior tournament naming conventions will notice a change in 2013, as USTA Colorado has approved new names for the Novice division (**FUTURES**) and the Satellite division (**CHALLENGER**). Championship will remain Championship. If you're familiar with the way ski areas classify their runs, think of **FUTURES** as Easier/Green runs, **CHALLENGERS** would be Intermediate/Blue runs, and **CHAMPIONSHIP** events would be Black Diamond/Advanced runs.

LOW COMPRESSION BALL EVENTS

Beginning in 2012, USTA Colorado implemented the 10 and Under Tennis rules for all 8s and 10s divisions, as well as adopting the Green ball for use in Junior Team Tennis 12s Novice matches.

For 2013, the Green ball has been added for Junior Team Tennis 12 Intermediate A and B divisions, and has also been mandated for use in all 12s Futures and Challenger tournament divisions.

Tournaments incorporating low compression balls and age-appropriate courts/nets appear with a color-coded dot next to the event.

- **RED** ball (8 and Under Divisions); 36-foot court; 2'9" net; 19"-23" racquets recommended
- **ORANGE** ball (10 and Under Divisions); 60-foot court; 3' net; <25" racquets recommended
- **GREEN** ball (12 and Under Divisions); 78-foot court; 3' net; 25"-29" racquets (depending on player size)

Many 12 year olds and younger will be competing in tournament tennis for the first time this year. The process to register for tournament play may seem confusing, so USTA Colorado has tried to simplify some of the most challenging parts for parents with our **"8 Things Every Tournament Player (And Parent) Should Know"** on page 27. Once you've identified the appropriate age division/skill level for your son or daughter, we've provided you with a primer on how to get them signed up for the right event. 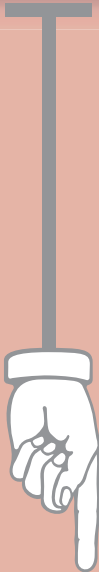

That which we call LEAGUE, by any other name, would smell as tennis-y.

CTA Silver Senior → CTA Adult 65 & Over

40s FORMAT FINAGLE:

Due to court limitations throughout most of Colorado, the local league format will be 1 singles and 2 doubles positions per team match for the USTA Adult 40 & Over league. Since the District Championships are part of the National advancement process, we are required to follow the USTA National format for Districts, which is 2 singles and 3 doubles. All teams entering this league must have at least 8 players rostered by the team minimum deadline prior to the beginning of the league. The season has also been extended to include up to 10 weeks of matches.

THE ADDITION OF "+":

New for 2013, two 5.5 level players can be added to a 5.0 roster (USTA Adult 18 & Over) and two 5.0 players can be added to a team's 4.5 roster (USTA Adult 40 & Over). "+" players must play at the No. 1 singles or No. 1 doubles position (only one per team match)

FRIDAY NIGHT FLIGHTS:

Flights with six teams in the following leagues will add one Friday night match:

- USTA 18 & Over

TWEAKS 2 TWILIGHT, TRIO:
