



Parks & Rec/Metro State University as part of a collaborative effort to introduce the highly Latino, economically challenged Greenlee students to the sport of tennis. A combination of in-school tennis skill introduction by the PE teacher using the USTA School Tennis program resources and a free after school Kids' Tennis Club that took place on the brand new MSU tennis courts down the street gave close to forty 4th and 5th grade students a good start to playing tennis. Each of the students selected for the Kids' Tennis Club, taught by Denver P&R instructors and volunteers, received an appropriately sized racquet and ball to continue on with the sport. Additional after school program collaborations such as this are being planned for 2014.

Tony Delacruz (center) is the tennis coach at Denver's **North High School**. He learned about the Racquets For All donation program and called to learn more about how it works. "We received racquets last year and this year for the boys and girls tennis team here at North High School," Delacruz said. "I worked with Racquets For All who was very responsive and helped us with racquets and used tennis balls." Like most schools, North High is plagued with a small budget for athletics. Delacruz noted, "Our girls team grew from last year, and we are hoping to have the boys build as well."



WHEELCHAIR / ADAPTIVE TENNIS

WHEELCHAIR PLAYERS DEVELOP INDEPENDENCE, SELF-CONFIDENCE

Wheelchair tennis is one of the fastest growing wheelchair sports in the country. Rules are the same as stand-up tennis, except the wheelchair player is allowed two bounces of the ball, which makes it easy to pair a chair player and a stand-up player together for doubles, or even allow wheelchair competitors to participate in any sanctioned league or tournament without any other special considerations. One popular format is One-Up, One-Down doubles, which allows those with disabilities the opportunity to share in activities with their able-bodied peers and family and increases the playing opportunities available to players in wheelchairs.

While wheelchair tennis is a competitive sport, it offers participants much more. Brad Parks, who founded the sport in 1976, said "It's more than tennis for people in wheelchairs; it gives them their lives back."

In 2011, the USTA Colorado and the Blair-Caldwell African American Research Library partnered for the Colorado premiere of "Breaking the Barriers," an acclaimed national exhibit honoring African American achievements in tennis and encouraging greater diversity in the sport. The exhibit featured the Breaking the Barriers Portrait Series, by Pullitzer prize-winning photgrapher Barry Guiterrez. The Portrait Series celebrates a handful of Denver's black tennis pioneers who have helped shape the sport here in Colorado.

The documentary film, Crossing the Net: Denver City Park & The Black Tennis Experience, captures Denver's culture, spirit, and passion for tennis. The project was created by USTA Colorado as part of the original Breaking the Barriers/Denver exhibit and showcases the words, deeds, and aspirations of a few local heroes — pioneers who have made Denver City Park a true home for tennis and real community of avid players.

This year, USTA Colorado will bring two new Breaking the Barriers exhibits to the public — The Asian Red Thread Connection and ¡Vive el Tenis! The exhibits, which will feature two new portrait series by Guiterrez, will be part of USTA Colorado's exploration into Colorado's unique tennis history, as well as celebrating the pioneers of tennis from the Asian and Latino communities.

Along with the Latino Portrait Series, the Colorado premiere of the ¡Vive el Tenis! exhibit from the International Tennis Hall of Fame will take place in September, which explores the different paths tennis has taken from Europe to United States, Central and South America, Mexico and the Caribbean.







RULECHANGES2014



The Official Handbook of Tennis Rules and Regulations (including The Code), **FRIEND AT COURT** is an essential piece of equipment for every tennis player. 2014 FRIEND AT COURT - HIGHLIGHTS

Question: During a match, when can a player access Player Analysis Technology performance information from his "smart" racquet?

Answer: New Rule 31 deals with Player Analysis Technology which is equipment that may perform any of the following functions with respect to player performance information:

a. Recording; b. Storing; c. Transmission; d. Analysis; e. Communication to player by any kind and by any means

Player analysis technology may record and/or store information which can be gathered but not used for coaching during the playing of a match. It can only be used when coaching is allowed — such as during 3- and 10-minute Rest Periods (see Rule 30).

Question: If a player leaves the playing area to return a ball and is unable to make a play on the ball because of something or someone on an adjacent court (for example, a ball, chair, or person), is the player entitled to replay the point based on hindrance?

Answer: No (USTA Comment 26.7). Hindrance does not apply outside the playing area. The playing area is the area inside the fences or backstop. When there is a row of courts, the playing area includes the area between courts, but does not include any of the adjacent court or its doubles alley. Note that players' bags and chairs located between courts are always permanent fixtures and no player on any court is entitled to a hindrance when encountering these objects.

Question: On the first point of a set, may a doubles team position both players on the deuce side of the court?

Answer: Yes (USTA Comment 15.1), but the spirit of the rule requires that the server know which member of the receiving team is going to receive the first point of a set. The same principle applies to the first point of a 10-Point Match Tiebreak.

Question: Can an official off court still impose a penalty under the Point Penalty System even if one or more points have been played?

Answer: Yes (USTA Regulation IV.D.15). An official who is on the court shall impose penalties before the start of the next point. An official who is not on the court has a reasonable amount of time to reach the court and impose the penalty even if intervening points have been played. Any intervening points stand as played.

- Have eyesight correctable to 20/20

Well, for starters, tennis is fun, But more than that, tennis is a universal sport offering different opportunities to different players, among some of the following....

INDIVIDUAL OR TEAM SPORT You can play singles, doubles, and even compete as a part of a team. Can't decide? Try them all. The camaraderie of a team effort and the self-reliance of individual competition (nobody to blame but yourself) are both great environments for children (and adults) to learn different lessons.

COMPETITION Picking up a quick friendly match at the local courts, or entering into sanctioned USTA events, a competitive tract exists on almost all levels of play, from the novice player on up to the professional ranks.

CHARACTER BUILDING Honesty is a huge one. On the recreational level, instant replay doesn't exist. Line judges don't call every match. It's up to the players themselves to call lines and follow the rules. Many young players may start out making incorrect calls, but they quickly learn this isn't the right thing to do. Other character-building traits such as determination, commitment, sportsmanship and teamwork can all be learned through playing the game.

FAMILY SPORT The entire family can learn to play and develop their games, thus strengthening the bonds between parent and child, between siblings and even between parents.

STRESS RELIEVER When you're out there hitting that little yellow (or red, orange, or green) ball, nothing else matters. Not bills, not grades, no emotional turmoil one might be going through outside of tennis.

SOCIAL AND NETWORKING OUTLET Many players get together before and after matches for activities outside of tennis. Also, since the sport is universal, it offers countless networking opportunities. And, you can be almost be guaranteed that if you travel to any city, or up and move, you will find a tennis family upon your arrival.

LIFELONG SPORT Tennis, like few sports out there is a game you can play your entire life.

INEXPENSIVE A tennis racquet and some balls are among the least expensive sports equipment around, plus low-cost programming is available at local parks & recreation. Kids can hone their skills against a wall or garage door, and play a summer full of league tennis for about the same cost as a new Xbox game or PlayStation game.



THE COLORADO TENNIS JUNIOR PATHWAY

ROGY is an acronym for the progression of balls that junior players use as they grow older, beginning with low-compression balls and later to the traditional balls that virtually everyone is familiar with. In 2012, the USTA mandated the use of **RED** balls for kids eight and under, and the **ORANGE** balls for kids 10 and under. Colorado mandated **GREEN** ball use in 2013 for players 12 and under from novice through intermediate levels. When 12 year-olds have progressed through the low-compression ball lineup and are ready for advanced competition on a full-size court, they play with the standard **YELLOW** ball. At age 13, all players graduate to the traditional high-altitude ball used throughout Colorado.



At every stage of a junior player's development, there is a combination of age-appropriate equipment and events that are outlined in the Colorado Tennis Junior Pathway.

While not all players progress at the same rate, the pathway has been designed to assist parents and coaches in assessing where their young player(s) will be most comfortable.





A LOOK AT YOUTH COMPETITION

Studies have shown that competition is an essential component of learning and enjoying any sport. The key is to use competition as a tool to grow and develop the game—and the games of youngsters—not to crown champions or turn late developers away from tennis. USTA Colorado advocates getting kids playing as quickly and capably as possible in a fun, welcoming environment.

As children develop an interest in tennis, Play Days, Junior Team Tennis and Sanctioned Tournaments are great ways to improve their skills and provide further development through a repetitive combination of non-elimination, team and competitive opportunities.

Play Days, Junior Team Tennis and Tournament play are integral development components of a young player's progression in the sport.

Kids don't need to "graduate" from one to the other, they should use each format as a vehicle to help them learn the strategy and tactics of tennis—by playing matches.

PLAY DAYS

Play Days are a great way for kids to play tennis in a fun, non-elimination, competitive environment. It is a wonderful companion to playing Junior Team Tennis and competing in sanctioned junior tournaments.

ANDVANDE YOUR CHANT

Over the duration of a few hours, a Play Day allows kids to serve, rally and score in informal competition. Players participate at their level against opponents of similar skills. The emphasis is on participation, effort and sportsmanship, as opposed to highlighting the achievements of certain players. These low-key competitions are organized in formats that allow children to play again and again, whether they win or lose, and allows them to improve their skills without focusing on the outcome of a match

JTT

Tennis is a great team sport. Each year more and more kids are learning and competing as part of a team. They enjoy the social aspects of a team environment, the camaraderie of teammates and the support and encouragement of a coach. Many middle schools and most high schools offer tennis teams that allow kids to be with their friends, represent their school and compete as a team.

Colorado Junior Team Tennis provides kids the opportunity to learn and compete on a team and be with their friends. Matches and practices are team-based and are fun because kids have the support of teammates and coaches. Colorado JTT has divisions for junior players at a variety of skill levels—Futures (entry-level), Challenger (intermediate) and Championship (advanced)—and ages 10 and under through 18s.







BEGINNING THIS YEAR, Colorado's tournament offerings for entry-level (Futures) and many intermediate (Challenger) junior players are going to look a whole lot different than in years past. In an effort to provide a better tournament tennis experience for youth players in Futures and select Challenger events, USTA Colorado requires all sanctioned entry-level events to guarantee multiple matches by instituting modified scoring and scheduling formats. In all intermediate tournaments, players will be guaranteed a minimum of two matches.

The changes put Colorado at the forefront of a growing movement across the country that challenges the age-old standard of forcing inexperienced competitors into a lose-one-and-you're-done scenario. to experience tournament play.

BENEFITS TO PLAYERS

Kids competing in Futures tournaments are typically unaccustomed to competitive tournament play. Following a nationwide study that showed that more than onethird of first time tournament samplers never played in another tournament, it became apparent that the product just wasn't working for that level player. By instituting these directives, USTA Colorado anticipates that entrylevel tournament players will find the experience far more welcoming and exciting. More matches is more fun, and playing in an all-day event against a variety of opponents provides a much more social atmosphere than a lose-one-and-you're-done experience. For new players, it means more time with friends, meeting new people and just hanging out between matches. It's fun and easy for players to see who else is playing and how everyone is doing. It also gives players the flexibility to commit to other family/sports/school/etc. opportunities.

Compass draw formats are tailor-made for the tour-

nament sampler, who get real tournament experience without the expense, time and travel commitments of traditional week-long tournaments. Matches tend to get more competitive after each round, since players of similar skill levels tend to gravitate towards the same brackets. So, when you lose, your matches get easier and when you win they get harder.

BENEFITS TO PARENTS/RELATIVES

Finding time to be a parent is hard these days, and the traditional week-long tennis tournament format certainly didn't help those parents who were new to tennis. By condensing a tournament to a single day (perhaps two, given advancement play), parents have a concrete idea of what sort of time commitment they are signing up for, and that gives them the flexibility to plan around the event.

But even more important as a parent, you want your child to succeed, and the compass draw format keeps matches competitive, allowing better players to play tougher matches and less-skilled players to play easier matches. This keeps kids from getting discouraged and helps them feel successful.

BENEFITS TO COACHES/FACILITIES

Compass draw tournaments are a perfect way for junior players to practice the skills they are learning from their coaches. For many tennis coaches who want to watch their pupils compete in their first tournament, it can become a challenging prospect if they have to remain flexible for an entire week in order to counsel their charges prior to and after the match. With the new formats, coaches can help players recognize mistakes and correct them over the course of a day of matches. This repeated feedback from coaches can greatly benefit young players who are experiencing competitive tennis

for the first time.

The major benefit for host tennis facilities comes both in terms of overall participation numbers and the streamlining of event management. As more and more children are enticed to step into tournament play, facilities will reap the financial benefit because of a larger pool of players.

MULTIPLE MATCHES

In the Futures, tournaments will adopt either round robin or compass draw formats, guaranteeing players a minimum of three matches. In Challengers, competitors will be guaranteed two matches (although some Challenger events will offer round robins and compass draws).

SCORING MODIFICATIONS

The compass & round robin draws in Futures events will use different options, ranging from short sets (first to 4), one-set formats or timed formats (8s and 10s divisions only). Futures events will also adopt no-ad scoring for all matches. All Challenger events are required to offer a minimum of two matches, although many tournament directors have chosen to implement the one-day/modified scoring/multiple match format).

SINGLE-DAY SCHEDULES

With the exception of indoor events, all Futures tournaments will complete pool play in a single day, with advancement play taking place on a subsequent day. Challenger tournaments aren't required to complete their draws in a single day, but many tournament directors recognize the many benefits to players and parents of a one-day format, and are configuring their draws to accommodate them.



FFIC: Full Feed-In Consolation— A draw in which the losers from the main draw are fed back into another draw against players who lost in earlier rounds of the tournament.

FMLC: First Match Losers

Consolation — A draw in which the first-round losers and second round losers who advanced to that round by virtue of a bye or default enter the consolation draw.

FRLC: First Round Losers **Consolation** — A draw in which only the first-round losers enter the consolation draw.

MFIC: Modified Feed-In Consolation

 A draw in which the main draw losers are fed back into another draw against players who lost in earlier rounds of the tournament.







RR: Round Robins - Multiple match guarantees as players compete against all other players in their flight/bracket.

Compass Draw: Player-friendly formats guaranteeing players multiple matches, even if they lose every match. A non-elimination format that is so named because players advance in four to eight different directions depending upon when they lose their first match and when they lose their subsequent matches.
