Its mission is to promote and develop the growth of tennis in Colorado, coordinating recreational and competitive tennis opportunities for players of all ages, abilities, and backgrounds. A not-for-profit organization, USTA Colorado invests 100% of its resources into growing the game.

We provide grants to organizations that want to introduce tennis to their communities and we offer scholarships to junior players who seek to take their game to the next level. We coordinate adult league play for 35,000 players across the state, and offer programs for junior players of all ages and abilities. Our sanctioned tournament schedule offers more than 160 events this year, including opportunities for wheelchair athletes. The Colorado junior tournament formats have been redesigned so as to be more player and parent-friendly by offering guaranteed multiple matches and shortened events.

We are in the parks. We are in recreation centers and in private clubs. We are in schools helping physical education teach-

ers introduce our kids to a game that they can play for a lifetime, keeping them fit and healthy. We believe that fundamental tennis principles like sportsmanship, hard work and personal responsibility translate into every area of life. Through tennis we are helping people realize their potential both on and off the court.

We are 23,000 members strong, but our scope is not confined to those players alone. We represent the nearly 500,000 tennis players in our state, providing information and opportunities to play for each and every one of them. We reach out to all players, including those of diverse cultural backgrounds, mentally and physically challenged athletes, and under-served communities. Diversity and Inclusion is a strategic priority for USTA Colorado and one of our core values.

USTA Colorado believes in providing opportunities for everyone to participate, regardless of skill, age or background. We are actively investing in communities throughout Colorado to help promote and grow the game of tennis.

Some of the ways USTA Colorado is active in the tennis community:

- Comprehensive in-school and extracurricular tennis program training, resources and consultation for little or no cost;
- Collecting and redistributing tennis equipment for use by people and programs in need;
- Support of opportunities for individuals who may not have access to tennis such as people with disabilities or with limited resources; and
- Free technical consultation and grants for new court construction and renovation.

USTA SCHOOL TENNIS

Through the USTA School Tennis program, USTA Colorado offers support, resources and equipment incentives to school for little to no cost. Through our partnership with schools, we seek to enrich the lives of elementary, middle and high school youngsters by giving students an opportunity to learn the basic skills of tennis through their physical education classes, and then developing extracurricular tennis playing programs. The program includes a free training workshop for physical education teachers which gives them the skills and materials necessary to teach tennis. Teachers gain access to a comprehensive step by step curriculum, discounted equipment and free student assemblies. The end result is that students are becoming more fit, and having fun doing it, while learning some of the basic skills in a sport that will last them a lifetime.



Then, whether it's a Kids Tennis Club, Lunchtime Tennis, intramurals or leagues, USTA is committed to providing the training, expertise and resources you need to give kids in elementary, middle or high school the opportunity to play and have fun outside of the school day.

Over the last 15 years, USTA Colorado has helped introduce more than 750,000 kids to tennis through their physical education classes, and is searching for new schools to partner with across the state. In 2015, USTA Colorado expects to be actively involved with more than 200 schools, reaching upwards of 75,000 students.

TURNING OLD RACQUETS INTO NEW DREAMS

Pam Hollenbeck may arguably be coaching the most unique high school tennis team in Colorado. Hollenbeck, the head girls tennis coach at Denver South High School who also coaches the boys in the fall, had 50 girls out for the girls' team this past spring. Thirty-one of those girls came from other countries.

Hollenbeck said Denver South's culturally diverse enrollment includes one-third of its students from the local neighborhoods, one-third are choice students from other areas and one-third from other countries who are in the school's English Language Acquisition (ELA) program, which is designed to teach students who speak languages other than English how to understand, speak, read and write in English.

"There's two reasons they're in the United States. In general, they want to pursue a better education or lifestyle, and they're refugees," said Hollenbeck, a special education paraprofessional at Denver South.

Sixty-two percent of Hollenbeck's team comes from all over the world including Burma, Thailand, Mongolia, China, Rwanda, Iraq, Libya, Pakistan, Somalia, Korea and Sudan.

"All of the countries, except for a couple of them, are in difficult parts of the world," Hollenbeck said.

Tennis has been the saving grace for the girls.

"On the court, I run into language barriers," Hollenbeck said. "I'm really good at hand signals now. The good news about these kids is they're so anxious and eager to learn, and they really try hard. Their attendance is nearly perfect."

Prior to the season, 25 of the girls had no tennis racquets, so the **Colorado Youth Tennis Foundation's Racquets For All program** supplied Hollenbeck with racquets that fit every girl.

"I cannot tell you how meaningful it was to the girls. They don't get things like that often where people just hand you stuff and don't expect anything from it," Hollenbeck said. "I use it as a vehicle to promote goodwill and happiness."

SPECIAL POPULATIONS

WHEELCHAIR PLAYERS DEVELOP INDEPENDENCE, SELF-CONFIDENCE

Wheelchair tennis is one of the fastest growing wheelchair sports in the country. Rules are the same as stand-up tennis, except the wheelchair player is allowed two bounces of the ball, which makes it easy to pair a chair player and a stand-up player together for doubles, or even allow wheelchair competitors to participate in any sanctioned league or tournament without any other special considerations. One popular format is One-Up, One-Down doubles, which allows those with disabilities the opportunity to share in activities with their able-bodied peers and family and increases the playing opportunities available to players in wheelchairs.

While wheelchair tennis is a competitive sport, it offers participants much more. Brad Parks, who founded the sport in 1976, said "It's more than tennis for people in wheelchairs; it gives them their lives back."

ADOPT A COURT GRANTS

A collaborative effort by the USTA, USTA Intermountain and USTA Colorado helped Rocky Mountain Tennis Center rebuild after the historic floods in September 2013 destroyed much of the facility.

Through the USTA Facility Assistance Program and USTA Adopt A Court grants, Rocky Mountain Tennis Center was awarded \$30,000 to resurface and repair eight existing tennis courts that were damaged by last year's floods. A check presentation took place on June 12, 2014 at Rocky Mountain Tennis Center.

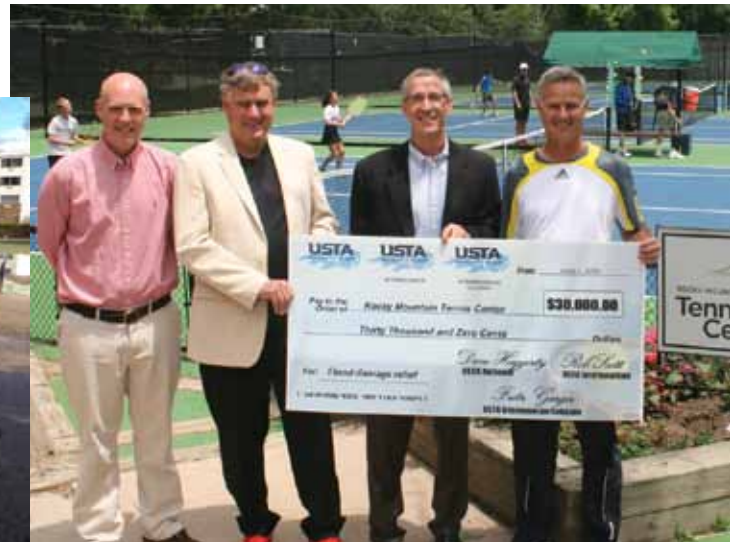
"We are committed to enhancing and building more tennis facilities in communities across the country," said Kurt Kamperman,

Chief Executive, Community Tennis, USTA. "This program allows us to assist in the development process of providing usable tennis venues to people of all ages, abilities and backgrounds to play and enjoy the health benefits of our great game."

At the local level, USTA Colorado has allocated over \$100,000 since 2004 in Adopt A Court grants to help support public tennis facility enhancements, renovations, and new construction projects.

USTA Colorado has invested more than \$100,000 into the Colorado tennis community through its Adopt A Court grant program.

The deadline to apply for an Adopt A Court grant is April 1, with a secondary deadline of October 1.

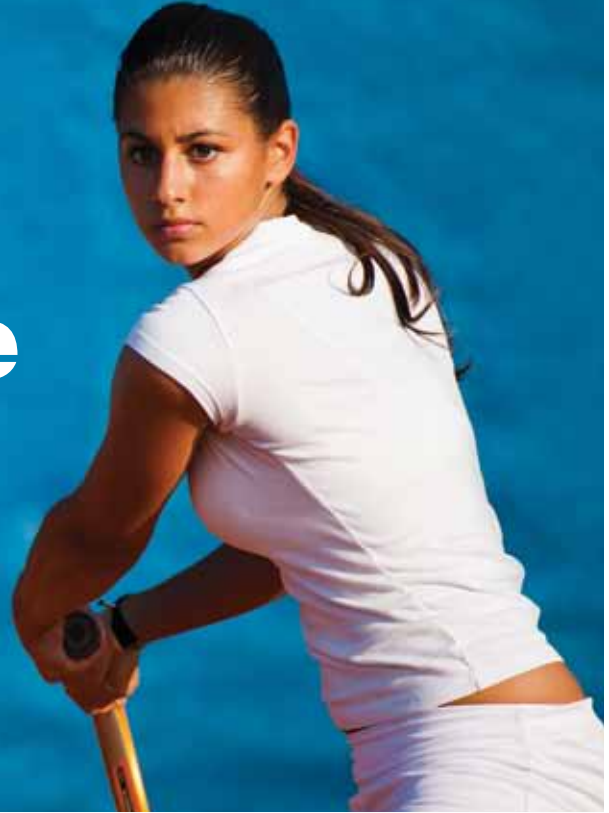

USTA Colorado Junior Sanctioned Tournaments offer a wide variety of formats to accommodate players of virtually any age and skill level. Events are categorized by age, ranging from 8-18. Level 8 events are entry-level (Futures), Level 7 events are for intermediate play (Challenger), and Levels 3-6 events are for advanced players (Championship) seeking the highest level of competition in the six-state Intermountain Section. Level 1-2 events are for players qualifying for National competition. Colorado's multiple-match, single-day A.C.E format guarantees a player-friendly experience while also helping parents manage their kids' busy schedules.



FREE MEMBERSHIP: Sanctioned tournaments require a valid USTA membership. USTA Colorado will provide all first-time tournament players with a free membership, and the USTA offers free memberships to kids 10 and under.



MEMBERSHIP NOT REQUIRED: A USTA membership is not required to play Colorado Junior Team Tennis. For less than \$30, players get 7 weeks of matches during the summer plus the chance to compete at the State Championships.



Tennis is a great team sport, and **Colorado Junior Team Tennis** provides kids the opportunity to learn and compete on a team and be with their friends. Matches and practices are team-based and fun because kids have the support of teammates and coaches. Colorado JTT has divisions for junior players at a variety of skill levels—Futures (entry-level), Challenger (intermediate) and Championship (advanced). Age divisions begin at 10 and under.

MEMBERS ONLY: All adult leagues and sanctioned tournaments require a valid USTA membership (except for Flex Leagues).



USTA Flex Leagues allow individuals to schedule matches when and where it's convenient. Great for new and returning players, players new to town, and players wanting to meet new players in match competition — singles, doubles and mixed. Players receive a 6-8 match schedule to be completed over a two-month season.

USTA Colorado offers one of the nation's largest recreational **Adult League Tennis** programs, with more than 35,000 players across the state. Play singles, doubles, or give mixed doubles a try. There are leagues for men, leagues for women, and even leagues that can lead you to the National Championship. JUNIORS



KIDS & TENNIS: A NATURAL FIT

Tennis is one of the most popular sports in the United States and is the second most-played sport worldwide.

Free or low-cost courts are available in nearly every community at schools and parks, and organized programs for kids are common throughout the country. All a child needs to get started is a racquet and some tennis balls. The cost of an introductory racquet and balls is extremely reasonable so the starting expense of playing tennis is among the lowest of any sport.

Tennis provides children with a place they can go and be independent, meet friends and be active. It also provides kids with a way of meeting new friends whenever they move to a new area. Whether it is moving to a new school or to a new home, the local tennis court will always provide great social opportunities.

There is a starting point for every child who is introduced to tennis. The first experience might be on a playground with friends, or it may be in the driveway with a parent or family member. Really, it could be in any number of settings—at school during physical education class, during recess, or in a before- or after-school program. Many youth program providers also offer tennis, generally in after-school or summer programs, and introductory tennis classes are common in most communities in Colorado and are typically offered by parks, camps or clubs.

However it happens, once your child has that first experience and develops a perceived level of ability—the thought that, “Hey, I can do this”—it is important to identify opportunities for your child to participate. Your child has several options when they begin the sport, and it's important that they are given opportunities to develop at their own pace and participate in events with other kids of similar ability levels.

Junior play is based on three components....

AGE

Is your child ready to ROGY?

At every stage of a junior player's development, there is a combination of age-appropriate equipment and formats that helps a child learn while having fun. ROGY is the acronym for the progression of balls that young players use as they grow older, beginning with low-compression balls and later to the traditional balls that virtually everyone is familiar with. See where your child fits using the graphic on page 21.



SKILL

Entry-Level (Futures)

This player is developing consistency when hitting medium-paced shots, but lacks execution when trying for directional control, depth or pace. Player is learning court coverage. Beginning to learn correct positioning for singles and doubles. Entering competition for the first time.

Intermediate (Challenger)

This player has achieved improved stroke dependability but may still lack depth and variety. Can occasionally force errors when serving. Court coverage is improving. Rallies may be lost due to impatience, or lack of confidence in shots.

Advanced (Championship)

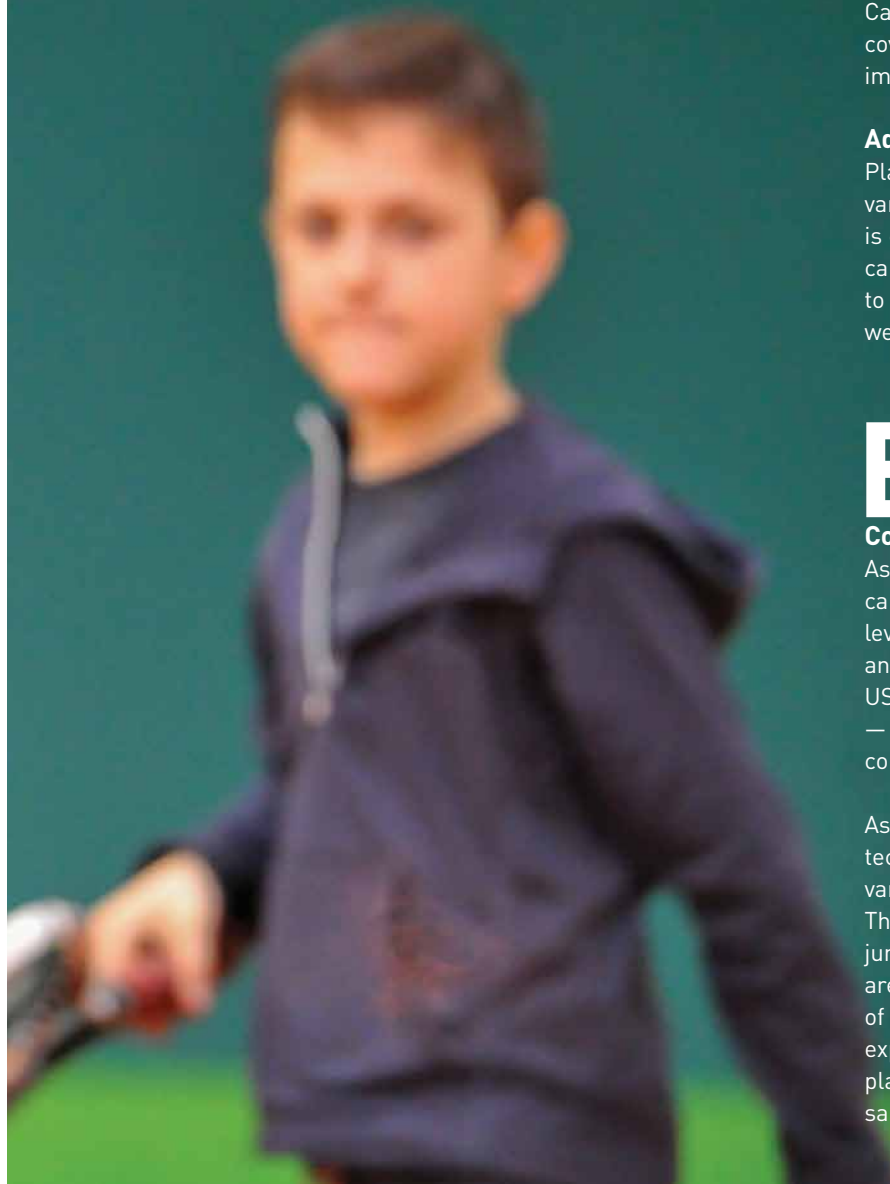
Player has dependable strokes and has begun to vary the use of pace and spins. Court coverage is exceptional. Uses first serve as a weapon and can place the second serve. Players are beginning to develop game plans based on strengths and weaknesses.

EVENT

Competition

As juniors grow in both skill and experience, they can find competitive opportunities to suit their level of play. In both team (Junior Team Tennis) and individual (Sanctioned Tournaments) events, USTA Colorado offers three levels of competition — Futures, Challenger, Championship — that correspond to the skill levels listed above.

As kids play more matches and improve their technique, strategy and court coverage, there are a variety of new challenges for them on the horizon. This year, there are more than 130 sanctioned junior tournaments in Colorado (many of which are now completed in 1-2 days), giving players of all levels across the state the opportunity to experience competition against similarly-skilled players. 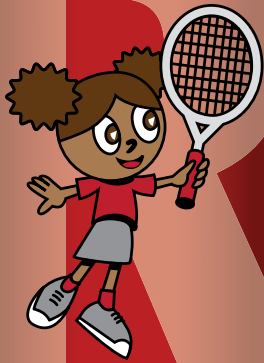

At every stage of a junior player's development, age-appropriate equipment and formats help children learn the game while having fun. **ROGY** is the acronym for the progression of balls that young players use as they grow older, beginning with low-compression balls, smaller courts and kid-sized racquets.



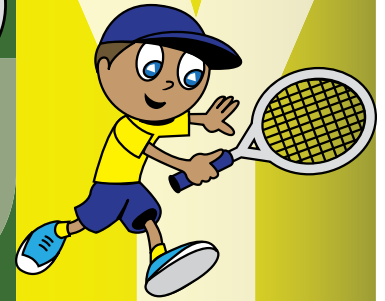

Slower balls, smaller courts and shorter racquets enable young players to rally and play much sooner. Players start to play individual and team games and activities, develop good technique and use simple tactics.

The RED ball is mandated for sanctioned play in all 8s Divisions:

- Level 8 (Futures tournaments);
- Level 7 (Challenger tournaments);
- Level 6 (Championship tournaments).



The 60'-court is larger and the ORANGE ball is smaller and faster than the RED ball but bounces lower and moves slower than the traditional YELLOW ball, thereby providing an optimal strike zone and helps players begin to develop better technique and all-court tactics.

The ORANGE ball is mandated for sanctioned play in all 10s Divisions/Levels (Junior Team Tennis & Colorado sanctioned tournaments):

- Challenger A/B (Junior Team Tennis);
- Level 8 (Futures tournaments);
- Level 7 (Challenger tournaments);
- Level 6 (Championship tournaments);
- Level 5 (District Cup tournaments).



Play moves to a regulation 78'-court and incorporates the GREEN ball—faster than the ORANGE ball but still slower and lower-bouncing than the traditional YELLOW ball. This helps players continue to develop good technique, movement, and implement advanced tactics.

The GREEN ball is mandated for sanctioned play in specified 12s divisions/levels:

- Futures (Junior Team Tennis);
- Challenger A/B (Junior Team Tennis);
- Level 8 (Futures tournaments);
- Level 7 (Challenger tournaments).



Once players have progressed through the RED, ORANGE and GREEN stages, they will be prepared to train and compete with a standard YELLOW ball on a standard 78'-court.

The YELLOW ball is mandated for sanctioned play in specified 12s divisions/levels:

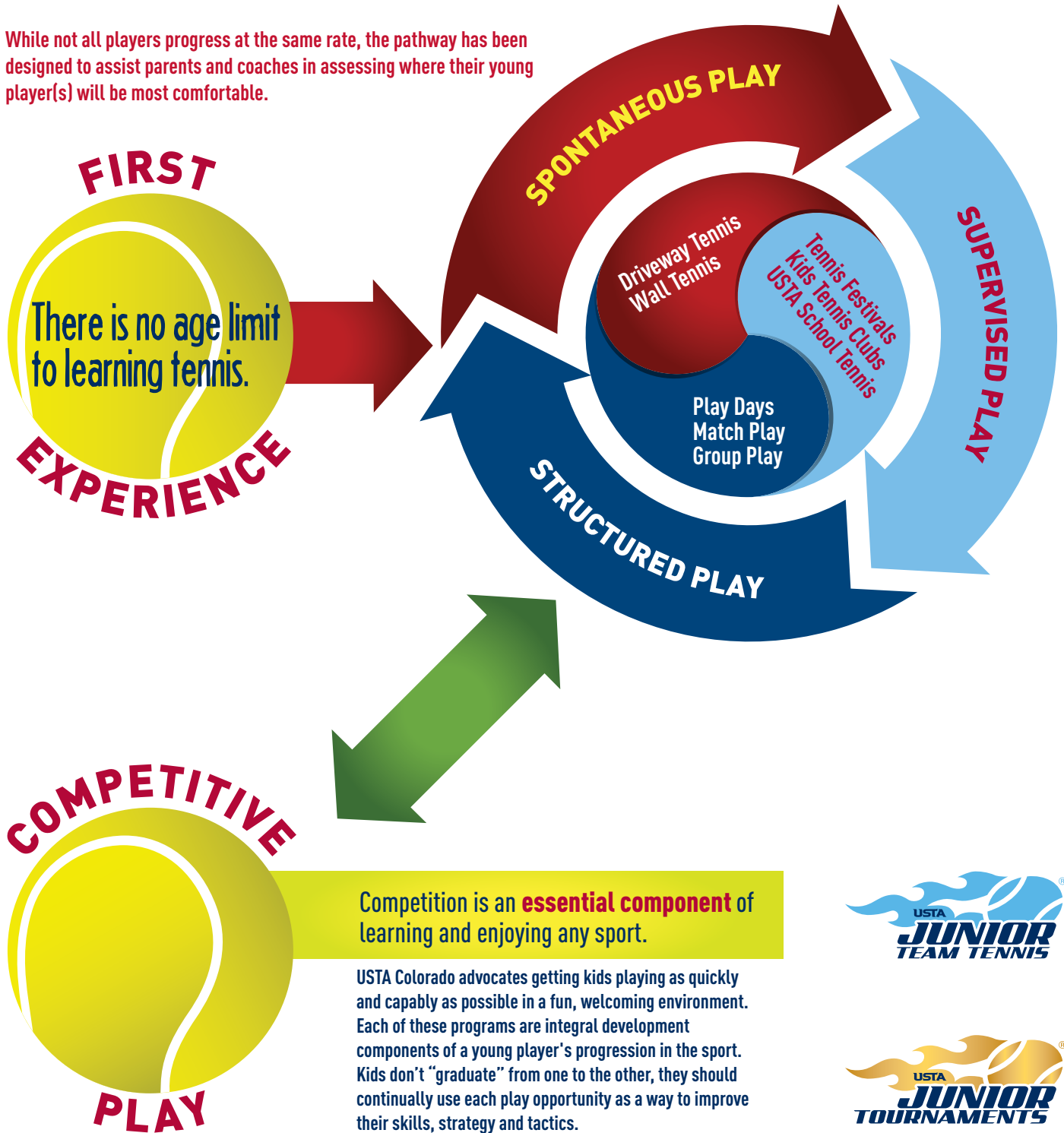
- Championship (Junior Team Tennis);
- Level 6 (Championship tournaments);
- Level 5 (District Cup tournaments);
- Level 4 (Masters Series tournaments);
- Level 3 (Section Closed Chps).

The YELLOW ball is also mandated for all levels of sanctioned play in the 14s/16s/18s divisions.

USTA INTERMOUNTAIN COLORADO

At every stage of a junior player's development, there is a combination of age-appropriate equipment and events that are outlined in the Colorado Tennis Junior Pathway.

While not all players progress at the same rate, the pathway has been designed to assist parents and coaches in assessing where their young player(s) will be most comfortable.

JUNIOR TEAM TENNIS

- The perfect start for the new player in a fun, supportive, team environment.
- Futures divisions are offered in every age category from 12-18. Players 10 and under who are just starting the sport are encouraged to play the Challenger B division.

- The perfect start for the new player in a fun, supportive atmosphere.
- All events use the Multiple Match A.C.E. format. Events take place in one day and all participants are guaranteed three matches.
- Players must know how to serve, rally and score.
- USTA Colorado provides a free USTA membership to any first-time Futures competitor.
- These event are not counted toward rankings.



EXPERIENCE ▼

LEVEL 7/7+ CHALLENGER

JUNIOR TEAM TENNIS

- For players with more experience and who are looking for a team environment.
- Two Challenger divisions are offered in every age category from 10-18: A & B. Challenger B is for players new to the age group or with more limited experience. Challenger A is for more advanced intermediate players.

TOURNAMENTS

- Players should have experienced some success in Level 8/Futures tournaments.
- These tournaments are great for the player starting their junior competitive career and are interested in establishing a ranking.
- All events use the Multiple Match A.C.E. format. Events take place in one day and all participants are guaranteed three matches
- These tournaments count toward a USTA Colorado Challenger Ranking ("+" events carry extra points).

LEVEL 6/6+ CHAMPIONSHIP

JUNIOR TEAM TENNIS

- Championship divisions are also offered in every age category from 10-18, giving players who want to challenge themselves a place to compete in a team atmosphere.
- Higher-level players are invited to "play up" in an older age division to provide a more competitive experience.

TOURNAMENTS

- Players should have experienced some success in Level 7/Challenger tournaments.
- These tournaments are for the more serious junior competitive player.
- Some events have opted to use the Multiple Match A.C.E. format.
- These tournaments count for USTA Colorado & Intermountain Championship Rankings ("+" events carry extra points).

LEVEL 5 CHAMPIONSHIP DISTRICT CUP

TOURNAMENTS

- There are 12 District Cup tournaments held throughout the six-state Intermountain Section, two in each District (state), where the top players in each state come to compete.
- The top-ranked players are selected from those that apply.
- These events count toward USTA Colorado & Intermountain Section Championship Rankings with a higher value than the Level 6.

LEVEL 4 CHAMPIONSHIP MASTERS SERIES

TOURNAMENTS

- There are four Level 4 tournaments in the Intermountain Section, called the Masters Series: Winter, Spring, Summer & Labor Day. The top 32 players that apply are selected.
- These events count toward USTA Colorado & USTA Intermountain Rankings with a higher ranking value than the Level 5 and also count toward a USTA National Ranking.
- USTA National also offers Level 4 tournaments titled "Open and Closed Regionals" held around the country. Level 4 National tournaments played in Colorado may count for a Colorado ranking as well as a national ranking.

LEVEL 3 CHAMPIONSHIP SECTIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

TOURNAMENTS

- There are two Level 3 tournaments in the Intermountain Section, the Closed Summer and the Closed Fall Championships. The top 64 players that apply are selected.
- These tournaments have a higher ranking value than Level 4 events and count toward USTA Colorado, USTA Intermountain and USTA National Rankings.

A better tournament experience is as easy as....



1 DAY TOURNAMENT

Playing in a single, all-day event against a variety of opponents provides a much more social atmosphere than a lose-one-and-you're-done experience. In addition, ACE benefits parents by alleviating the challenge of having to reschedule their lives around dropping off their young players for tennis tournaments at various hours of the day for an entire week.

Providing a better tournament tennis experience for youth players is vital to helping kids embrace competition.

2 PLAYER-FRIENDLY FORMATS (ROUND-ROBIN & COMPASS)

Compass draw and round-robin formats are ideal for junior players looking to practice the skills they are learning from their coaches, who can help players recognize mistakes and correct them over the course of a day of matches. This repeated feedback can greatly benefit young players who are experiencing competitive tennis for the first time.

*In an effort to make changes that will benefit both players and parents, USTA Colorado adopted the multiple match **A**(bbreviated) **C**(ompetitive) **E**(xperience) format, or **ACE**, in 2014.*

3 GUARANTEED MATCHES

The ACE format requires all sanctioned entry-level (Level 8/ Futures) and intermediate (Level 7/Challenger) events to guarantee entrants three abbreviated matches, which keeps the competition fresh and player-friendly.

In 2015, all entry-level (Level 8/ Futures) and intermediate (Level 7/ Challengers) events have adopted the ACE format.

ACE puts Colorado at the forefront of a growing movement across the country that challenges the age-old standard of forcing inexperienced competitors into week-long single-elimination events: the traditional lose-one-and-you're-done scenario.

FINDING THE RIGHT EVENT:

3 There are more than 130 junior events listed in the 2015 Big Book of Colorado Tennis, but figuring out which tournament to play can be intimidating. Parents are encouraged to review the BIG BOOK for DUMMIES section, as well as the Player Overview page. When your son or daughter is ready for tournament play, scan the Tournament listings for the right level — L8 (Futures), Level 7 (Challenger) and Level 6 (Championship) — and the appropriate age/gender division. Be on the lookout for the ★ ● ● ● ● icons which will help you quickly identify the right event based on the type of ball your child is using.

KNOW THE BASICS:

2 While it's unreasonable to expect even a seasoned player to know all 300+ pages of the Official Rules of Tennis plus the 50-odd pages of The Code, it is extremely important that **all players know the basics of tennis etiquette and scoring.**

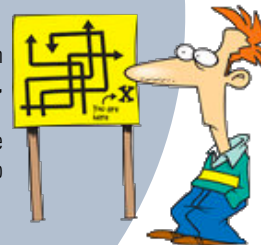

4 UNDERSTANDING THE TOURNAMENT SCHEDULE:

Each tournament listing contains detailed information about the type of event, format, dates and deadlines, contact info and a registration number.

But which is which, and what does it all mean? Be sure to visit the **HELP DESK** (p26) for a detailed breakdown of the listings and how to read the sometimes cryptic language of **Tournamentese**.



THE 8 THINGS EVERY TOURNAMENT PLAYER (AND PARENT) SHOULD KNOW

5 RESOLVING JTT CONFLICTS:

Junior Team Tennis and tournament play are great companions, and young players are encouraged to do both. Any Junior Team Tennis players who discovers scheduling conflicts with a local tournament should contact the Tournament Director immediately. Directors are required to accommodate the player if the match falls on a Monday during the Junior Team Tennis league season.

6 FUTURES/CHALLENGER TOURNAMENT UPGRADE:

In an effort to make entry-level and intermediate tournaments more player- and parent-friendly, USTA Colorado has implemented the **Modified Match A.C.E. Format** for all sanctioned **Level 8** (Futures) and **Level 7** (Challengers) tournaments. A description of the ACE Format can be found on the facing page or online at COLORADOTENNIS.com.



7 COACHING:

Tennis teaches many valuable life lessons, like self-reliance, integrity and problem-solving. As a spectator at your daughter's soccer game, you may be tempted to offer helpful suggestions about strategy and technique, but **coaching is forbidden during a tennis match.**

8 SPECTATING 101:

Keep all comments positive and supportive of both players. **Winning a tennis match is hard enough; players don't need the additional pressure of spectators voicing their frustrations or offering "assistance" during the match.**

DOs

- Clap or cheer for all players on the court
- Make friends with other parents at the event
- Keep a positive attitude and stay cheery on the sideline
- Teach your child good sportsmanship and fair play
- Treat your child the same whether he or she wins or loses
- Support your child emotionally and logistically
- Realize all children develop their tennis skills at different rates



DONTs

- Clap or cheer for a double fault or unforced error
- Try and take your coach's job
- Make enemies with your child's opponent's parents
- Act negatively or angrily on the sidelines
- Encourage your child to be unsportsmanlike or make unfair calls
- Belittle or get upset with your child if he or she has a bad day on the court
- Compare your child's progress with that of other children

*MODIFIED FORMATS (Some events offer variations to the traditional single-elimination format)

FMLC: First Match Losers Consolation — A draw in which the first-round losers and second round losers who advanced to that round by virtue of a bye or default enter the consolation draw.

FRLC: First Round Losers Consolation — A draw in which only the first-round losers enter the consolation draw.

MFIC: Modified Feed-In Consolation — A draw in which the main draw losers are fed back into another draw against players who lost in earlier rounds of the tournament.

RR: Round Robins — Multiple match guarantees as players compete against all other players in their flight/bracket.

Compass Draw: Player-friendly formats guaranteeing players multiple matches, even if they lose every match. A non-elimination format that is so named because players advance in four to eight different directions depending upon when they lose their first match and when they lose their subsequent matches.

ROGY: this quick reference guide helps players and parents identify those events that correspond to various levels of play and/or age divisions.

A **BLUE** ★ indicates which tournaments are utilizing the multiple match A.C.E. format (details on p24).

The following balls/courts are mandated for different ages/levels of play:

- **RED** ball (8 & Under Divisions); 36-foot court; 2'9" net
- **ORANGE** ball (10 & Under Divisions); 60-foot court; 3' net
- **GREEN** ball (12s Futures/Challenger Divisions); 78-foot traditional court
- **YELLOW** ball (12s Championship Divisions/All 14s-18s Divisions); 78-foot traditional court

LEVEL: All junior sanctioned tournaments in Colorado are assigned a specific level, ranging from 3-8 (3 being the highest).

Ranking points vary depending on the level of the event. A full description can be found on page 23.

RULECHANGES2015

2015 FRIEND AT COURT-HIGHLIGHTS

Question: During a point, a player's cell phone rings – does he lose a point for hindrance? What happens if it rings on a changeover?

Answer: Yes, if a player's cell phone rings during a point, the opponent may claim the point based on a hindrance. If the cell phone rings during a changeover or between points, there is no loss of point or a Time Violation – the cell must then be turned to off or set to vibrate. A player may wear a cell phone in vibrate mode, and there is no penalty if the phone vibrates during a point -- page 19, USTA Comments 26.3 and 26.4

Question: Can both amateurs and professionals play in all USTA tournaments?

Answer: In 2012, the NCAA changed its regulations to allow Division I tennis players to accept a limited amount of prize money before enrolling in college without jeopardizing their amateur status. In response, the USTA has amended a variety of relevant USTA Regulations to allow both amateurs and professionals to play in all USTA tournaments. USTA Regulation XVI.A.5 now specifically prohibits prize money at Junior Tournaments.

Question: What should an official do when a player grunts or shrieks so loudly that play on the court or nearby courts is affected?

Answer: An official can call a hindrance for excessively loud noise such as a grunting or shrieking, but only on the court from which the noise emanates--FAC Comment IV.D-17

Question: Does the junior suspension point system apply only to tournaments listed on the National Junior Tournament Schedule?

Answer: No – the system has been revised and can now apply to all sanctioned junior tournaments. The expanded system appears as USTA Regulation IV.F and Table 18

Question: When a player's hat flies off, is the official required to call: "let, replay the point"?

Answer: If a player's hat flies off, a ball drops from a pocket, or some other item of clothing falls off, the official now calls a let ONLY if the official determines that an opponent was hindered. Previously, the official was always required to call a let – FAC Comment VII.C-9

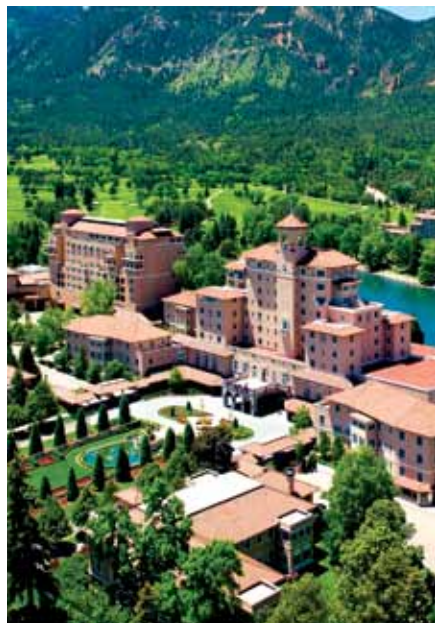
